Trip To London

- And one from each of Data General's European subsidiaries.

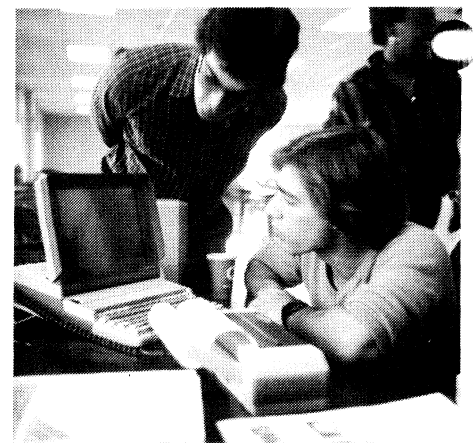
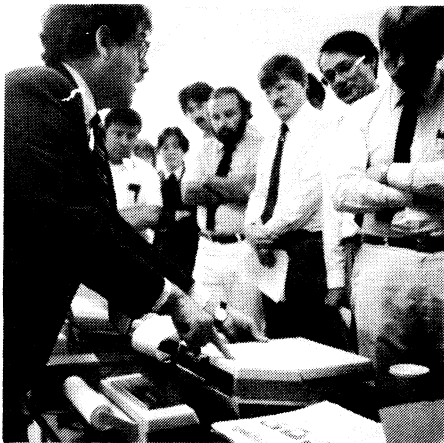
At The Centrum

Data General introduced this week a new Tempest workstation, the DASHER D460T, that has the leading price/performance features among multi-purpose Tempest workstations. Basic prices for the new workstation start at just over \$4,000.

American Express Is Corporate Credit Card

Data General has chosen American Express as the corporate credit card for frequent travelers and is instituting a corporate credit card program beginning on October 15.

Employees eligible for the card should have received information and an application. Employees who travel six times a year and/or incur \$2500 in business-related expenses are eligible.

Anyone who is eligible and has not received an application may contact Phyllis Prager at extension 5581 in Westboro.

The American Express card will be for business use only and will cover hotel, meal, airline and car rental expenses when traveling in the United States or internationally. Airline and car rental reservations, where possible, will continue to be made through Corporate Travel and Meeting Services.

This new Corporate Card System provides more convenience and offers improved benefits to both the traveler and the company.

For the traveler, advantages include a worldwide accepted multi-purpose credit card; company payment of the credit card fee; the elimination of use of personal or family credit cards; consolidation of business expenses on a single monthly bill; reduced need for carrying cash; the facilitation of hotel reservations; and check cashing privileges.

For Data General, the system will allow for easy generation of reports for travel analysis; reduce cash advances; and improve administrative procedures.

Users of the American Express card issued through Data General will report all charges made with the card as "employee paid" expenses on their Expense Report. The employee will then receive and pay a single monthly American Express bill.

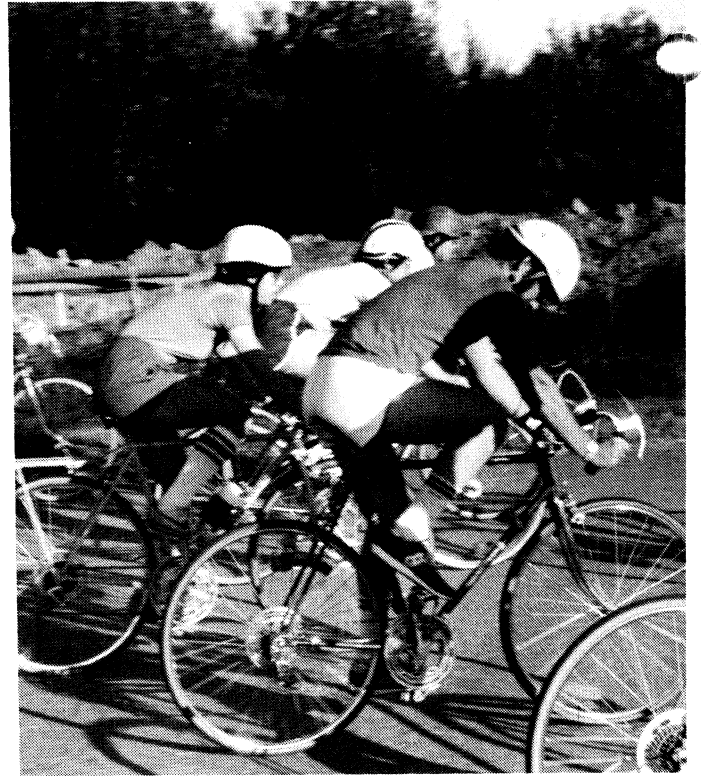
