Run For The Money

While shoulder-to-shoulder with more than 4000 people, Tim Webster and Wayne Fitzsimmons had more on their minds than just stretching their muscles prior to the start of last month's Boston Marathon.

Although highly-qualified athletes, Tim, a senior interior designer at Westboro, and Wayne, vice president of Americas Far East, never expected to beat the likes of Bill Rodgers and win any of the prize money being offered to the top finisher of this year's race.

For them, the 26-mile race presented a different sort of challenge. By their own asking, their task

was to run the race to raise as much money as possible for the fight against multiple sclerosis (MS).

And run they did. Tim and Wayne raised a total of \$2300 for MS. The money will be used to help approximately 200 people a week fight the major disabling disease.

Most marathon runners will tell you that running 26 miles can be "excruciatingly" difficult, but Tim's pain was soothed by thoughts of helping others. Comments Tim on his second year of running for MS, "After about 20 miles, your body no longer is in control. The race then becomes a near-religious experience. Your mind, the crowds, and the children offering water and soda - all steer the way. The additional goal of getting the money to help to defeat this insidious disease (MS) adds yet another dimension. My thoughts turned to helping those who cannot help themselves."

Although he has competed in several other marathon races worldwide, this was Wayne's first appearance in the Boston Marathon. For him, the challenge to help those who are physically less fortunate added a new importance to the effort. Says Wayne, "Running the marathon, training hard and becoming fit has its own personal rewards. These are magnified tenfold when you are accomplishing such a feat to benefit people suffering from MS."

Enhancements To Graphics Display Controllers

Performance and functionality enhancements have been added to Data General's GDC/1000 and GDC/2400 Graphics Display Controllers (GDC). They include faster display of text and rapid read-back of screen information. In addition, increased off-loading of the host computer will allow GDC processors to execute operations otherwise performed by the host computer software.

GDC processors perform color shading of images; two-dimensional transformations such as movement, scaling, rotating two-dimensional objects; and hidden surface removal.

GDCs are tightly integrated with the ECLIPSE MV/Family of computers, providing distinct advantages for systems developers. Data General is the only major minicomputer manufacturer that offers GDCs that are completely integrated with 32-bit systems.

Federal And Commercial Applications

Data General's GDCs are especially suitable for systems integrators, prime contractors and original equipment manufacturers who require graphics capability as part of large applications systems.

Applications include the display of image data from a satellite, medical instrument or any other sensing system. GDCs also are useful in computer-intensive military and civilian simulation programs. When integrated with a computer, GDCs become powerful workstations for high-speed design, engineering and solids modelling.

Funds Help In Purchase Of Emergency Vehicle

Marlboro Hospital soon will have a new emergency van, thanks in part to a donation by Data General. The company has donated \$2000 to help the hospital continue to provide the latest in medical technology and service for the community.

Marlboro Hospital is replacing its five-year-old vehicle with one outfitted with the latest equipment to help emergency personnel better care for patients. The van currently in use has covered more than 45,000 miles, serving nine surrounding communities including Westboro and Southboro. It has conducted approximately 9323 emergency "house calls." Once the newer van is purchased, the older van will continue to be used as a back up.

Responding to emergencies will not be the only function of the new vehicle. It also will be used for

educational purposes, such as in career awareness and training programs at local schools. In this way, the new van will serve the entire community.

According to Dave Dimmick, Donations administrator with the Public Affairs department, the donation will benefit "a large contingency of Data General employees." "Whatever the company can do to help the hospital operate more efficiently and at a lower cost, also helps our employees located nearby," says Dave.

To Your Good Health

At some time or another, everyone has come to work feeling "under the weather." Often, a visit to the nurse may be all employees need to help get them through the day. Occupational health nurses at Data General may offer employees temporary relief, or in some cases, refer them to an outside medical professional. Whatever the case, nurses are always ready to assist employees with the medical attention and support they need.

Last week, the Data General nursing staff from plants across the U.S. met at Westboro to discuss ways to better serve employees. During the two-day conference, nurses reviewed medical policies and procedures, and evaluated new medical techniques. They examined pilot programs instituted over the past year such as smoking cessation, hypertension and wellness programs, and shared their own experiences and medical knowledge. In this way, the conference provided participants with a common approach to handling various medical problems within each facility.

Dedicated Professionals

Nancy Powers, head occupational health nurse, describes the company's Health Services staff as professionals dedicated to helping people live longer, more productive and healthier lives. She comments, "As nurses, we do not only put on band-aids or keep occupational health records. As our name implies, Health Services offers a range of good health awareness programs such as hypertension-screening clinics, smoking cessation sessions and cardio-pulmonary resuscitation

courses."

According to Nancy, Data General Health Services not only assists employees with their physical ailments, but it also has a referral program which "supports the whole family." For instance, employees may find help with family concerns such as caring for the elderly, problems with children, alcoholism or substance abuse. "Confidentiality is always extremely important when employees come to us seeking help," states Nancy.

"Seeing people get well and return to being productive is a personal satisfaction we, as nurses, all share and bring to our jobs each day," she adds.

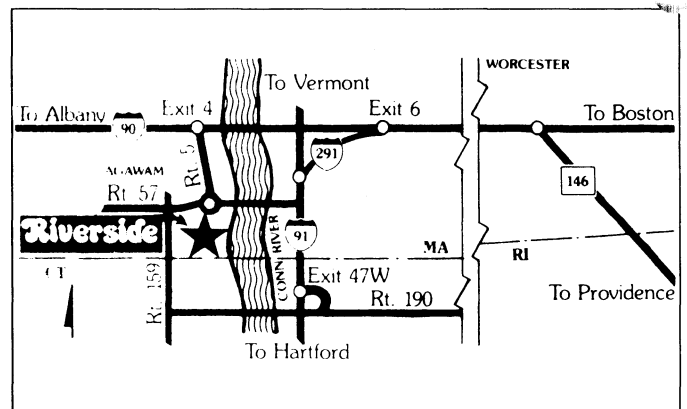
Riverside Outing Is Tomorrow
