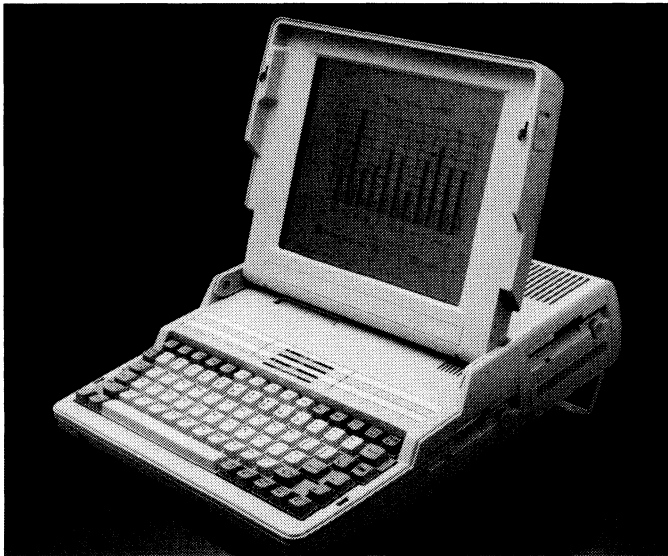

Don't Forget The Shades

Windows throughout buildings 14A and 14B in Westboro have been outfitted with shades in order to cut the amount of light visible from outside of the facilities during the evening hours. All employees with offices next to windows should make sure to close the shades each night before departing for home.

DATA GENERAL/One Model 2 Available For Employees



One version of the DATA GENERAL/One Model 2 personal portable computer comes with a liquid crystal display (LCD) screen which incorporates the latest technology to provide twice the contrast of previous LCDs.

The DATA GENERAL/One Model 2 personal portable computer now is available to employees through the Employee Purchase program. Employees may purchase the electroluminescent (EL) or liquid crystal display (LCD) versions of the model 2 computer as well as associated software and accessory products.

The following discounts will apply:

- 45 percent for hardware items
- 45 percent for software packages
- 30 percent for supplies and accessories
- 30 percent for upgrades

Payment can be made by personal check, payroll deduction for part or all of the purchase amount, or cash. If paid in cash (personal checks will be accepted), an additional 10 percent can be deducted from the total net employee discount purchase price.

The DATA GENERAL/One Model 2 computer with the EL screen has the viewing quality of a full-size computer display terminal and can be seen in any lighting situation. The LCD incorporates technology that provides it with twice the contrast of previous LCDs.

The 12-pound system measures 3-by-14.3-by-11.8 inches. Its main memory is expandable up to 640 kilobytes. The portable computer runs the MS/DOS operating system and is compatible with the IBM PC-XT computer to run software designed for the IBM PC.

DATA GENERAL/One Cited By Magazine

The DATA GENERAL/One personal computer was the featured guest at a reception hosted by *PC World* magazine and held at the Computer Museum in Boston. The magazine's publisher, Bartlett Rhoades, formally presented Data General with a plaque in commemoration of the portable computer's first-place rating in a readers' poll of the best laptop-size computers available today.

This marks the second consecutive year *PC World* readers have chosen the DATA GENERAL/One computer as their system of choice. It out-distanced similarly-sized offerings from Hewlett-Packard, Tandy, Zenith, Panasonic, Toshiba, Kaypro, Grid and others. The magazine's October issue features the results of its poll in which 300,000 readers declared their favorite hardware and software products in 39 PC-related categories.

In telling its readers that the 12-pound system copped the highest honors for a computer of its size, *PC World* states that "Data General still owns the hearts of PC users."

TEO/Electronics Featured At ADEE East

TEO/Electronics, Data General's recently-introduced software environment for the technical computing market, recently was featured during the Automated Design and Engineering for Electronics East (ADEE) trade show held in Boston.

TEO/Electronics is a logic design, rule-checking, simulation, timing analysis and documentation system integrated with CEO comprehensive electronic office software tools for use by electronic equipment and systems designers. This unique combination makes TEO/Electronics the newest generation in electronic design automation software.

Data General's demonstration at the show focused on how the product can be integrated within an engineering group. To do this, the Data General display booth included an engineer designing and simulating a gate array using TEO/Electronics.

With TEO/Electronics, new elements can be added ad hoc, and the engineer can interactively design and simulate without extracting and recompiling data. The demonstration showed how TEO/Electronics' object-oriented technology manages design complexity and ensures that logic errors are caught immediately during the design process.

Next in the demonstration, a second engineer incorporated the gate array design into his system, and simulated his complete design, including the array sub-circuit.

The demonstration then focused on integration across the organization. Using the Design Database Language (DDL), the engineers created two different extracts from the TEO/Electronics database. One extract was a bill of materials for purchasing, and the other was a component list for manufacturing. These extracts were mailed across the organization using CEO software, completing the integrated demonstration sequence.

New Courses Offered For Managers

For Middle Managers:

Strategic Management Workshop

A 2 1/2-day management simulation program designed to give participants the opportunity to manage a financial services company for a day and get feedback on their management skills, from both an operations and an interpersonal skills point of view. Attendance by nomination of divisional vice president.

Team Effectiveness Program

A three-day program to teach managers how to facilitate team development sessions in their own work groups.

For First Level Managers:

Frontline Leadership I

A three-day program that concentrates on managerial relationships, both up and down the organization; confronting issues, gaining support, and getting your ideas across. Especially useful for less-experienced managers.

Frontline Leadership II

A three-day program that focuses on how managers can influence ongoing performance through realistic feedback and recognition. Deals with setting performance standards, and coaching to improve work performance.

Note: Frontline Leadership I is a pre-requisite for this course.

(Managers who have taken Management Development Course (MDC) should not take Frontline Leadership II).

New Courses Offered For Professionals

Effective Technical Presentations

A two-day course for senior technical professionals and managers who need to polish their ability to present technical information to various technical and non-technical audiences. Participants will be video-taped and coached on their technical presentations.

Effective Communication

A two-day program for professionals whose jobs require significant interaction with others on a one-on-one basis. Key topics include interpersonal communication process (verbal vs. CEO), getting and giving good information, critiquing other's work and keeping your manager informed.

(Employees who have taken One-On-One Communication, should not register for Effective Communication.)

Extending Your Organizational Effectiveness

A 3 1/2-day program that helps professionals learn how to work more effectively within the formal and informal organizational structures and how to relate people resources to the business.

Managing Interpersonal Relationships

A 2 1/2-day program that focuses on your work style, how to identify the work style of others, and how to increase your versatility when interacting with people with different work styles.
