Holiday Reminder

Employees are reminded that next Friday, July 3, is a Data General paid holiday. Because of this holiday, *Mini News* will not be published next week. Group Marketing And Sales; Manufacturing And FE Combined

Data General has combined its Group Marketing and field Sales organizations under Herb Richman, executive vice president; and its worldwide Manufacturing

and Field Engineering organizations under Frank Silkman, senior vice president of Manufacturing and Field Engineering.

The Group Marketing area, under Vice President Dave Lyons, had previously reported to President Ed de Castro in his acting capacity as head of the Information Systems Group. The Group Marketing organization will now be responsible for marketing computer and communications products to commercial end-users and the key industry markets that the company has targeted. Dave now reports to Herb Richman.

Data General's Field Engineering organization, under Senior Vice President Dick Camuso, had reported to Herb Richman. Worldwide Field Engineering will continue to be responsible for providing support, maintenance and repair services for customers worldwide. Dick now reports to Frank Silkman. Frank's title prior to this announcement was senior vice president for Manufacturing.

"These two organizational changes reinforce our commitment to continue to deliver superior products and service to our customers," says Ed. "By combining our sales and marketing areas into one unified operation, we increase our awareness of our customers' needs and our ability to market integrated products and solutions that meet those needs. By bringing together our Manufacturing and Field Engineering organizations, we are placing product responsibility from manufacturing inception to end of product life cycle under a single organization. This should result in further improvements in system reliability and customer satisfaction and our efficiency in meeting our customers' needs."

Rack-Mounted ECLIPSE MV / 2000 Computer Introduced

Data General has expanded its 32-bit product line with the introduction of the ECLIPSE MV/2000 RM computer system. This new computer is a rack-mount version of the ECLIPSE MV/2000 system introduced last year.

Developed by the Special Systems group in Southboro, this product is targeted at OEMs and sys-

tems integrators. The ECLIPSE MV/2000 RM offers a cost-effective solution for the technical environment. The system cost-effectively extends full ECLIPSE MV/Family power to as many as 24 users, depending on the application. It is available for both stand-alone and networked configurations.

The ECLIPSE MV/2000 RM system comes in a package that is 19 inches wide by 26 inches deep by 7 inches high.

The base system board is a technologically-advanced and innovative 15-square-inch printed circuit board that contains relatively few system parts, and results in a very reliable product. It features a CMOS gate-array ECLIPSE MV/Family CPU, chosen for its density, low power requirements, and speed.

This computer system is available with various memory, disk and I/O configurations. To meet specific user needs, the base system can be expanded, with up to four option cards that easily plug into the base system board.

The ECLIPSE MV/2000 RM system is supported by a wide range of Data General operating systems including AOS/VS, AOS/DVS, DG/UX, or DG/RDOS. The system can also run Data General's MV/UX, in conjunction with AOS/VS or AOS/DVS.

Pricing for an ECLIPSE MV/2000 RM computer ranges from \$18,000 to \$24,600.

Service Extended To Additional Non-Data General Hardware

Data General has expanded its On-Call Support Services to include additional selected non-Data General hardware products integrated into customers' Data General computer systems.

The announcement follows another made earlier this month that Data General was extending support to the IBM family of personal computers, along with popular peripherals and options cards, that are part of Data General's new DG/PC*Integration network. The move is further evidence of Data General's commitment to supporting mixed-vendor environments, providing customers with a single source for service.

Among the hardware products Data General will support are Genicom, Dataproducts and NEC printers, Unix interactive voice processors, and Micom communications equipment. During the coming months, Data General will continue to add more non-Data General printers, plotters, drives, controllers and other hardware products to this list.

"Customers who have a variety of other vendors' peripherals connected to their Data General systems will no longer need to seek service from a myriad of suppliers," says Dick Camuso, senior vice president of Worldwide Field Engineering. "Our field engineering force will be able to isolate a problem on a customer's system, whether it be with a supported non-Data General peripheral or a Data General product, and then solve

that problem. This is part of our growing commitment to deliver complete service and satisfaction to our customers."

Federal Systems Division Leaves A Good Impression



Data General's Federal Systems Division recently announced the new ECLIPSE MV/15000T (Tempest) and ECLIPSE MV/15000R (Rugged) computer systems series at AFCEA-East, the largest military equipment electronics show of the year, which was held in Washington, D.C. The new series, the computer industry's most powerful Tempest and Rugged systems, are capable of processing more than six million instructions per second (MIPS) with their most powerful versions. Shown in the above photo is Data General's booth at the show. More than 450 companies, with 1,500 industry and military exhibits, attend the three-day exposition each year.

Toastmasters Teaches A Variety Of Skills

For more than five years, the Data General Toastmasters group has been teaching employees better speaking skills. But the group provides much more than that.

According to Michael Cadden, vice president of the group, Toastmasters allows for evaluation and feedback as members practice public speaking skills in a non-threatening environment.

"Toastmasters focuses on the fundamental skills of speaking before a group, including body language and choice of words," Michael says. "But what the group can help employees improve goes beyond fundamentals. We've seen a number of members improve their overall self-confidence, and go on to become excellent public speakers."

Michael stresses that the benefits of learning to address other people in a public forum can extend to outside interests.

"The skills taught in Toastmasters can be applied to a number of interests, including political, religious, social or civic activities. We have had members use what they have learned to become more active in church groups and political organizations. And, of course, many have gone on to give successful business presentations, as well."

The Toastmasters group meets each week on Wednesday at noon, ordinarily in the MTI conference room in Westboro. Meetings last an hour, and each one is set up to allow for member participation. According to Michael, members are asked to play a particular role each week during the course of the session.

"We have someone act as the toastmaster each week. This person is responsible for coordinating and moderating the meeting. We have members act as timers, evaluators and speakers. Two or three speeches are presented during each session.

"The most important aspect is the feedback on the speakers' performance. We videotape speeches about once a month, as well. Speakers are evaluated not so much on what they say, but how they say it. We want members to learn to be confident, persuasive and comfortable in front of any audience."

Toastmasters is an international organization, with several groups throughout Massachusetts. Next month, the Data General Toastmasters will hold a joint meeting with the Toastmasters group at Prime.

Have You Filled Out Your New W-4 Or W-4A?

The Tax Reform Act of 1986 requires that a new W-4 or W-4A be submitted to employers no later than October 1, 1987. Failure to comply with the law can result in a higher federal withholding. If a new W-4 or W-4A form is not submitted to a Data General Payroll site by October 1, the Payroll departments are required to alter employee exemptions according to the law. The law states that "if a new form W-4 or W-4A is not submitted, the employer must withhold if the employee is single, claiming one withholding allowance, or married claiming two withholding allowances, depending on whether the employee checked the single or married box on the most recent W-4 on file with the employer."

Employees can obtain W-4 and W-4A forms at the Payroll department. Should you need assistance filling out either form, the IRS, through its Taxpayer Service, can help answer your questions and provide you with additional information.

A blood drive will be held in Westboro on Tuesday, July 14 and Wednesday, July 15 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day. A blood donor facility will be set up in the Guest Marketing area in Building 14A.

If you are more than 18 years old, weigh at least 110 pound and have not donated blood over the past eight weeks, you may participate in the upcoming donation program.

The blood collected during this Red Cross-sponsored program will be used to service more than 150 hospitals in Massachusetts and Maine. The patients most likely to use the blood you donate are those who are afflicted with the following disorders:

- Cancer
- Heart disease
- Gastrointestinal disease
- Fractures and trauma
- Anemia
- Obstetric procedures
- Bone and joint diseases
- Lung, liver and kidney disease

More and more people are expressing a concern about donating blood because of the fear of contracting AIDS. However, it is impossible to acquire AIDS by donating blood. All the equipment which is used to draw blood is sterile and non-reusable, including the needles. The site on the skin from which blood is drawn is thoroughly cleansed.

Benefits

New Stock Purchase Period Begins August 1

Information and enrollment forms for the Employee Stock Purchase program were mailed to the homes of **newly-eligible** employees the week of June 15.

Employees who work at least 20 hours a week and have one year of service on August 1 are eligible to have a specific dollar amount deducted from their paycheck each week to purchase Data General stock. The amount of the deduction can be as low as \$5 or as high as 10 percent of your basic earnings on the first day of the period. The stock will be purchased at 85 percent of the average market price on the first or last day of the payment period, whichever is lower. The new payment period will extend from August 1 to January 30, 1988.

If you are currently participating in the plan and wish to make a change for the period beginning August 1, you can obtain the necessary form from your Human Resources representative or your local Benefits department.

Employees who receive sales commissions are reminded that the 10 percent maximum they can contribute to the program is based on their benefit salary, **not** their base pay.

Also, all employees are reminded that when they receive an increase in pay the percentage of their contribution does not automatically increase to reflect the pay raise. They must submit a new Authorization form specifying the amount they would like to contribute.

New participants or those making changes must complete an Authorization form and return it to the Benefits department no later than Friday, July 17.

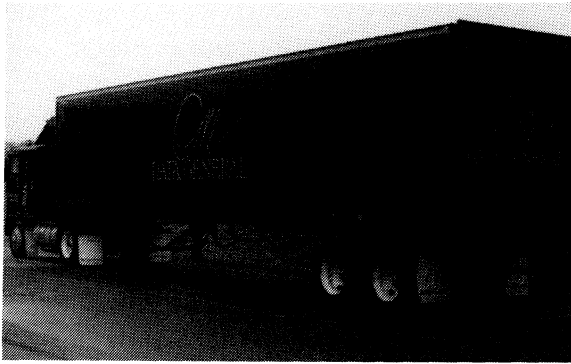
The Stock Purchase Plan is explained in a prospectus and a Stock Plan booklet available through your local Benefits administrator or the Corporate Benefits department in Westboro.

Auto Registration Set For Westboro

Data General-Westboro employees should register their cars next week with the Westboro Security department. The registration will provide the Security department with a listing of all cars which may be parked in a Data General-Westboro parking lot. The Security de-

partment relies on this listing so that it can contact employees if their cars' headlights are left on, or if the car has been involved in an accident. The Security department will not page unregistered cars.

Registration cards are available in both 14A and 14R lobbies and the Security Control Room, located at M Stop C-111. In the lobbies, completed cards (two per vehicle are required) should be stapled together and deposited in the boxes provided. It is important that employees register their cars next week.

Training

Listed below are the software and hardware courses for Data General employees being offered by Educational Services in July.

- **AOS/VS System Manager (S219/VS)** - Employees new to AOS/VS system management will learn how to install, generate, maintain and manage AOS/VS on an ECLIPSE MV/Family computer system. The prerequisite for this five-day course, which begins on Monday, July 27, is S209 (AOS & AOS/VS User) or equivalent experience.
- **Fundamentals of COBOL Programming (S110)** - This course provides an introduction to the COBOL language, principles, conventions, and programming techniques. Programming experience is needed to be eligible for this five-day class, which begins on Monday, July 27.
- **Introduction to 32-Bit Assembly Language Programming (S101/VSE)** - Employees taking this course will learn how to flowchart, code, edit, assemble, execute, and debug programs using Data General's ECLIPSE MV/Family 32-bit assembly language and utilities. The prerequisite of S209 (AOS & AOS/VS User) or equivalent experience is needed to take this ten-day class. This course starts on Monday, July 20.
- **C Language: An Introduction (SM131E)** - This special three-day seminar for employees provides hands-on experience with C programming under AOS/VS and MV/UX. It covers the data structures and syntax of the language. Employees should have experience in writing code in high-level language to take this seminar, which begins on Monday, July 20.
- **ECLIPSE MV/20000 Field Maintenance (H188)** - This course is geared toward technicians responsible for repairing ECLIPSE MV/20000 computers. This course provides a functional, board-level overview of the ECLIPSE MV/20000 computer. It also covers information flow and control functions within individual boards, between boards, and over system busses. Calling, running, and interpreting the three levels of diagnostic programs used to troubleshoot the ECLIPSE MV/20000 computer is also emphasized. This five-day class starts on Monday, July 20.
- **6060/6061/6067/6122 Disc Field Maintenance (H204)** - This course teaches the principles of operation

of the moving head disc drive, controller, and adapter, including seek, read and write sequences, and data channel operation. It also covers head alignment and all system adjustments. Employees should have taken 100 or H100/MV (Data General 16 or 32-Bit Computer systems) to be eligible for this ten-day course, which begins on Monday, July 27.

• **AOS/VS for the Hardware Specialist (H209)** - Employees familiar with data processing and hardware concepts will learn the basics of the Data General AOS/VS operating system, including system use, the Command Line Interpreter (CLI), startup and shutdown, monitoring and error recovery. This five-day class starts on Monday, July 27.

Prior approval of your supervisor is required for course registration. Call (tie-line) 221-1647 to enroll in these or other classes. All classes will be held at the Education Center at 2400 Computer Drive in Westboro.
