#### GAPS, Inc. **Founded to Offer Software Companies Needed Marketing Advice and Guidance**



from 1973 to 1983, has founded a new consulting company, GAPS, Inc., to provide marketing advice, guidance and services to small and medium sized software companies. Marketing in these companies has traditionally been very mixed and inconsistent. GAPS was formed to fill this need for quality marketing planning and execution.

GAPS offers a range of services including product positioning, market strategy, marketing research, sales and distribution planning, and a 'getting started' package for newly formed companies. This package includes the formulation of a marketing plan and its initial execution at a budget level in keeping with start-up phase companies.

Unlike many marketing consulting organizations, GAPS focuses on being as cost effective as possible. In these difficult economic times, having the highest quality marketing is essential to increasing sales, but hiring full time people of the needed caliber is expensive. GAPS can provide practical, experienced help in both strategic analysis and the tactical implementation of marketing and sales programs for small and medium sized software companies. They're at it again! There's a new start-up in town called Network Integrity, Inc. launched by Grey Eagles Ken Holberger, Chuck Holland and John Butler. The company has its headquarters in Marlboro, Massachusetts. Ken and Chuck were co-founders of Epoch Systems Inc., which was recently sold to EMC for a whopping \$140 million. John was a co-founder of Applix Inc., along with Jit Saxena and other Grey Eagles.

Network Integrity raised initial venture capital financing of \$3.75 million from a group of three venture capital firms. One of the lead investors was Grey Eagle Barry Fidelman of Atlas Ventures in Boston. Barry formed a syndicate along with Matrix Partners of Boston and NEA of Baltimore, to round out the financing team.




# East Coast Chapter 1993 Christmas Party


