Preface

This manual describes the DG/UX $^{\rm m}$ and AViiON® documentation sets. It is for all users, beginner and experienced. The DG/UX documentation set includes manuals for all software shipped on the DG/UX release tape: the base system and features such as graphics, communications, and the Network File System (NFS). The AViiON documentation set includes manuals for hardware and firmware components.

If you are installing your system and need to find your way through the installation process, see the Installation Roadmap that follows the list of figures. The Roadmap leads you through the installation documentation.

How this guide is organized

This manual contains an installation roadmap, two chapters, and an appendix. The following list gives an overview of what you will find in this manual:

Installation Roadmap

Guides you through the hardware and software documentation that you will need to install your computer system.

Chapter 1

Describes the DG/UX documentation set (software). It begins with diagrams that show manuals by category; for example, user manuals, administration manuals, and programming manuals. It also identifies the basic DG/UX documentation set you can use to get started. Then Chapter 1 lists manuals in each category.

Chapter 2

Describes the AViiON documentation set (hardware and firmware). It lists AViiON manuals according to installation/setup. Installation/setup manuals include setup guides for specific systems and installation manuals for specific peripherals.

Appendix A

Lists common tasks and topics and the manuals that contain information about them.

This manual does *not* cover every product that may be used with the DG/UX or AViiON system. Chapter 1 is limited to manuals for supported software on the DG/UX release tape. Chapter 2 is limited to hardware products, available from Data General, which are supported by the current DG/UX revision.




Figure 1-1 Categories of operating system manuals




Figure 1-2 User manuals




Figure 1-3 Installation and administration manuals




Figure 1-5 User-level programming manuals




Figure 1-6 Kernel-level programming manuals




Figure 1-7 X Window System and Motif manuals




Figure 1-8 Standards manuals and documents
