Future Directions Topic Of CPD Conference

Data General's direction for the future was the theme to a semi-annual conference held last week by the Systems Development Division's Central Processor Development (CPD) group.

More than 140 development people met at the Data General Training Center in Woodstock for two days of meetings and seminars that left them with a clear understanding of the company's business and product goals for the 1980s.

Kicking off the conference was a presentation by Vice President and Treasurer George McClelland who described the business and product transition Data General has gone through over the past four years. "It was important for us to understand why the organizational changes had been made and how they have left the company in a much stronger position than ever before," says CPD Manager Chuck Young.

"Staying abreast of Data General's plans for the future is crucial to employees," says Chuck. "In addition to presentations on Data General's financial structure, sales outlooks and future manufacturing processes, the conference provided the CPD employees with a clear view of computer technology trends so that they can become even better at designing computers."

Dave Herter, Information Systems Division (ISD) account development manager, spoke to the group regarding the competitive position of Data General's current product line in the marketplace today.

According to Chuck, the conference also gave CPD engineers and technicians a moment to "get to know" one another. Our two days at Woodstock gave everyone a chance to meet each other and discuss their particular projects," he said. To further personal growth, seminars were held dealing with the topics of stress management and career development.

Array Processing Comes To ECLIPSE and MV/Family Computers

A high performance, low cost block floating point array processor, the ArrayPlustm 2000, which brings 100 nanoseconds computational performance to all 32-bit ECLIPSE MV/Family computers and most ECLIPSE® systems, has been introduced by Data General.

The ArrayPlus 2000 is an intelligent, compact programmable array processor, targeted at OEMs, system integrators, and end users. It brings large scale computer performance at the price of a peripheral.

The ArrayPlus 2000 has a memory capacity of 512 Kbytes.

The new array processor is supported by Data General's AOS/VS, AOS/RT32, and AOS operating systems. Applications are written in ArrayPlus C, a powerful structured programming language, and can be used with most of the standard languages that Data General supports, including FORTRAN, PL/I and C.

Users can develop special algorithms on the ArrayPlus 2000 using a full set of development tools. High speed devices can be interfaced directly to the system to optimize real-time processing performance.

The ArrayPlus 2000 is designed to be used with the full range of MV/Family systems. Price for a configuration that includes the array processor with an ECLIPSE MV/4000 computer with 1MB of memory will be \$30,705 when sold in OEM quantities of 20. For the user who wants to add the ArrayPlus 2000 to a present system, the price for systems sold in single quantities will be \$18,000.

Two-Day PROXI Course Begins January 4

Customer Educational Services will offer a special two-day course on Data Entry and Edit on January 4 and 5 at the Boston Education Center, 2400 Computer Drive. The course is available to Data General employees only. Previous COBOL experience is a prerequisite.

Data Entry and Edit is designed for COBOL application programmers. It teaches how to use the PROXI COBOL code generator and librarian utilities to create screen formats and programs. The course includes classroom lectures and discussion, combined with lab exercises and demonstrations.


