WPI Course Registration January 6

Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI) is offering a Computer Science graduate course at Data General for the spring semester. The course, *Compiler Construction (CS544)*, will meet Wednesdays from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in Westboro Guest Marketing's Room A in the 'F' module.

Registration will be held in the Engineering Training classroom in Westboro on January 6 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Classes begin Wednesday, February 1 and will continue for 14 weeks.

In an effort to meet growing demand in the area of computer-generated slide production, Corporate Publications has expanded its Presentation Graphics Services (PGS) capabilities.

Shuttle Bound From Back Lobby

Beginning Tuesday, January 3, both passenger and mail shuttle service to Westboro from all locations including Southboro, Milford, Portsmouth and Westbrook, will run only to and from the rear (14B) lobby.

This recent expansion involves the purchase of the AGX 200, a powerful and cost effective computer-based slide system. This system allows for greater flexibility and timely turn-around in the creation of 35mm slides, color overhead transparencies, and color/B&W hardcopy.

Benefits include an available spectrum of 4,096 colors. Multi-tasking allows the operator to create slides while simultaneously printing out hardcopy for review or handout purposes. In addition, existing conventional photography can be combined with computer-generated slides.

It is projected that a central slide production facility will result in a 50% cost-savings to the company.

Presentation Graphics Services was developed in response to a growing demand for high-quality, professional presentation materials at Data General. Chuck Veit reports to Walter Volz in Corporate Publications Production as a highly skilled artist specializing in computer-aided design (CAD) presentations. Chuck is prepared to assist customers in the creation of symbols, logos or illustrations to effectively communicate their message.

Corporate Temporary Services - How to Apply

Corporate Temporary Services (CTS), a Data General program designed to provide clerical and secretarial support to Westboro, Southboro, and Milford, is available to departments in need of temporary assistance.

Those wishing to apply are asked to follow these procedures:

1. Fill out a form. Forms are available by calling CTS Manager Diana Carter at extension 4990, or in the CTS office, MS A237 in Westboro.
2. Submit the completed form. Appropriate signatures (two levels of management and vice

president of the respective department) must be obtained.

3. Return the form to the CTS office. A response, including the name of the person assigned and date of arrival, will be made to the requestor when the form is received.

Diana and Interviewer Jeanne Malecki are asking employees to refer, from outside the company, people with secretarial or word processing skills for possible participation in the program.

CTS recruits and trains people for temporary staffing on both a full- and part-time basis to assist when help is needed due to vacations, leaves of absence, illness, or short-term special projects.

Westbrook College Offers 10 Scholarships

Westbrook College in Portland, Maine is entering its second year of awarding up to ten \$1000 scholarships to children and other dependents of Data General employees.

This special financial aid program began in September 1983. George Menezes, the son of George Menezes, Information Management Product Cost manager at Data General-Westbrook, received the first \$1000 scholarship and is currently enrolled at Westbrook College.

Scholarships will be awarded to students who complete the appropriate college application procedure and are accepted as first-time, full-time Day Division students in the Computer Information Systems (CIS) program in either the associate or the baccalaureate degree curriculum. The CIS program utilizes an ECLIPSE MV/6000 computer system given to Westbrook College by Data General in 1982.

The decision to award the scholarships will be made by a committee in the college's Financial Aid Office based on: high school record; written recommendations from teachers or guidance counselors; and the potential for academic success at Westbrook College.

The scholarships will be renewable, provided the student maintains a 3.0 (B) grade point average. The college will work with scholarship recipients to package additional financial aid whenever financial need has been determined through the College Scholarship Services traditional procedures.

The scholarship will continue as long as the parent or spouse is employed at Data General. If a grant is terminated, the college will make every effort to replace the award with other sources of funding, so that the student may continue to complete the degree program successfully.

All students interested in this program for September 1984 must complete the application processes for admission and financial aid no later than May 1, 1984. Awards may be made prior to that date, and

the college will be unable to guarantee the availability of this special scholarship program after that time.

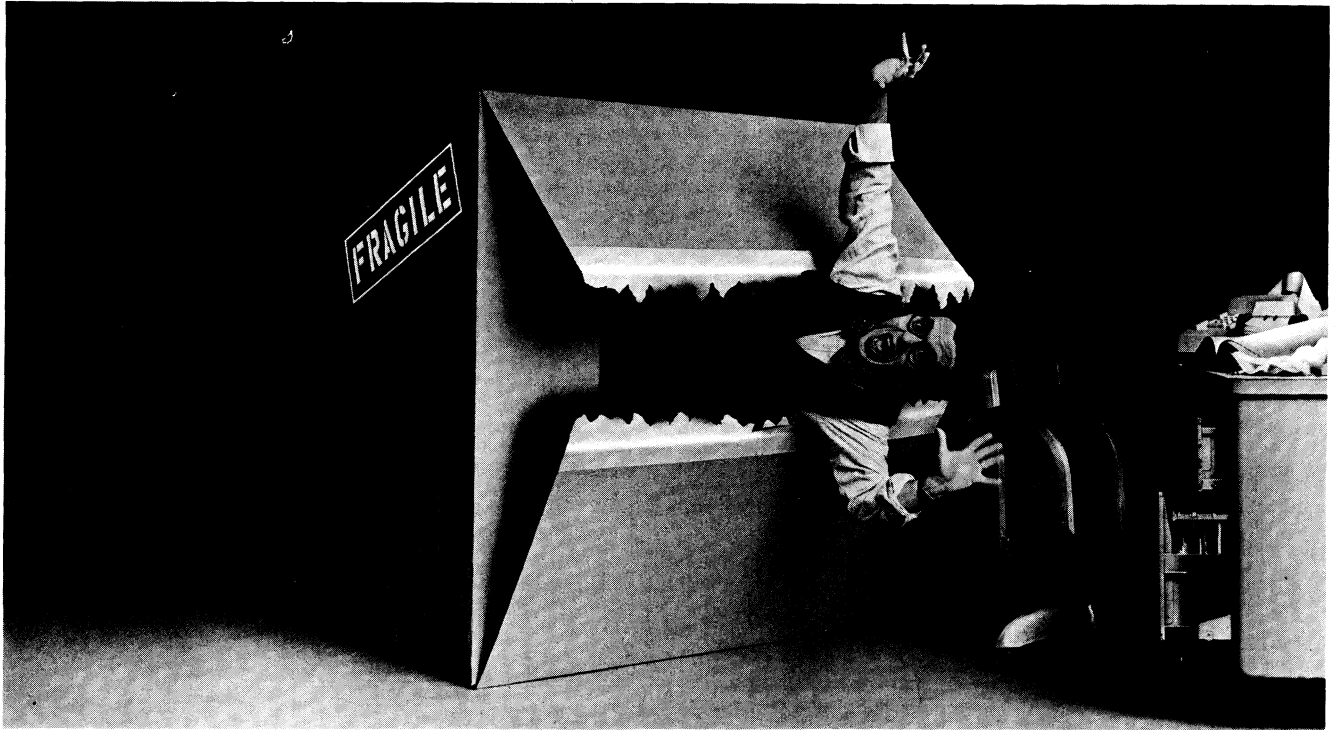

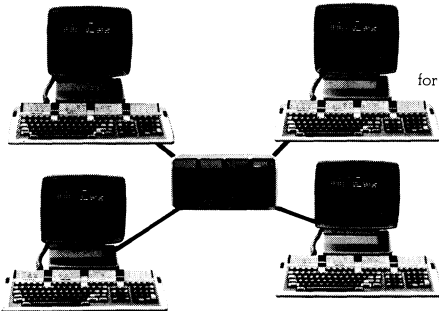
