Orientation Day coordinator John Gareri, a coop student from Central New England College, said, "We want to get the kids comfortable with computers. They know their folks work here, but some kids have never seen a computer."

Thirteen participants with varying levels of computer experience joined in the activities at the Education Center at 2400 Computer Drive in Westboro.

The film, "War Games" was shown along with software demonstrations of CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office, CLI, and PRESENT. Programming instruction in BASIC and other languages were also part of orientation day activities.

Assisted by Systems Training Specialist Bob Fogg and Software Instructor Brian Garney, the young programmers spent much of the afternoon pursuing individual interests by playing Hangman, Mastermind and other computer games.

Nine-year-old Jessica Ramos, daughter of Jose Ramos of Media Services, said her first experience with computers was "neat" even though she was apprehensive about "pressing the wrong button and blowing up" the system.

One of the more knowledgeable attendees, Katie DelGizzi, said she is considering a career in computers. The daughter of Gini DelGizzi, TIPS (Technical Information and Publications Service) administrator, Katie has been enrolled in her school's BASIC programming classes for the past two years.

While playing Star Trek on his terminal, Jim Moran, 16, said he was eager to attend the Orientation Day to get a better understanding of computers. Jim's mother, Kathleen, a technical editor in the Educational Technologies group of ES, said, "Computer Day was a great success. I am thrilled my son had a hands on introduction to Data General computers. We both hope there will be other 'computer days' in the future," she said.

Savings & Investment Deadline Approaching



The deadline for new enrollments and quarterly changes to the Data General Savings and Investment program is Friday, September 14. All enrollments and changes will become effective October 1. The program is available to all regular employees who have at least 90 days of service with the company as of October 1, 1984. Informational meetings to explain the program to interested employees will be held during the first two weeks in September. All employees are invited and encouraged to attend.

Newly eligible employees were sent a home mailing containing information about the program and the enrollment procedure. If you have not received this information, contact your Personnel representative or Benefits administrator immediately.

The Savings & Investment program is a benefit that provides Data General employees with the unique opportunity to defer the payment of federal income taxes while saving for the future. You can save from one to 10 percent of your pay before federal income tax is withheld, and you are saving in the easiest way possible - payroll deductions.

There are three investment funds to choose fromone to meet the needs of every investor. For those who want a guaranteed return on their investment there is the Guaranteed Income Fund which is currently paying 12.5 percent. For investors who are willing to take a risk the program includes the Balanced and Equity Funds. These are mutual funds which means there is a risk involved, but there is also the chance of a return greater than the Guaranteed Income Fund. Of course, there is also the option of investing in more than one fund. Invest art of your savings at a guaranteed 12.5 percent and the rest in one or both of the mutual funds for the possible higher earnings.

In addition to deferring federal income tax on both the money invested and the interest earned, the Savings & Investment program has other advantages.
