Fair Price Amendment Up For Vote At Annual Meeting

Proxy material for Data General's Annual Meeting, to be held Wednesday, January 30 in Boston, was mailed to all stockholders the week of December 17. All employees who own company stock should have received their proxy cards, the proxy statement and the new Annual Report.

This year's Proxy Statement asks stockholders to consider four proposals:

- Elect five directors;
 - oprove a fair price amendment;
- Approve an amendment to the Restricted Stock Option Plan to increase the number of shares to seven million from five and a half million; and
- Approve an amendment to the Employee Incentive Stock Option Plan to increase the number of shares to three million from two million.

The Fair Price Amendment is of particular importance this year. It would protect the interests of all stockholders by giving them greater assurance of equal treatment in the event of an attempted takeover of the company. It would deter "two-tiered"

offers for the company. Such takeovers occur when:

- 1) An offer is made for a limited number of shares at a price above the then market price in a first-step cash tender offer; and
- 2) The remaining shares are acquired at a later date via a merger offering a lower price or an exchange of securities with a lower value.

Please read carefully the description of the Fair Price Amendment on pages 13-21 of the Proxy Statement you received, including the discussion of "Certain Possible Disadvantages of the Fair Price Amendment" beginning on page 19.

Approval of the Fair Price Amendment would encourage prospective acquirers of the company to negotiate with the Board of Directors, which would be in a position to evaluate the fairness of an offer and study alternatives to protect the interests of the stockholders. The amendment will not make it more difficult for someone offering to buy substantially all shares of the company's common stock at the same price to all investors.

According to President Ed de Castro, "The Board of Directors believes that the adoption of this proposal is in the best interests of all stockholders and we are respectfully seeking your support."


Vote Your Proxy

Data General employees and their families own about 2,696,000 shares of the company, or almost 11 percent of shares outstanding. Their vote is important to the company's future. A 51 percent majority of outstanding shares are required to pass this amendment.

Please study the Proxy Statement and vote by filling out your proxy card, signing and dating it, and returning it in the enclosed return envelope. You may also return the proxy card via internal mail to the Public Affairs department, MS-A235, Westboro.

Social Security Deductions To Increase In 1985

The Social Security (FICA) deduction from employees' paychecks will be higher this year than last. The 1985 tax for employees is 7.05 percent, compared to 6.7 percent last year. In addition, the wage base - the maximum amount of earnings on which Social Security taxes are paid - rose from \$37,800 last year to \$39,600 this year.

Employees who earn \$37,800 or less a year will not notice as big a change in their Social Security deductions as employees in higher income brackets. If your earnings are \$15,000 a year, for example, you will pay \$52.50 more into Social Security in 1985 than you did last year. If your earnings are 7,800 you will pay \$132.30 more into Social Security this year. On earnings of \$39,600 or more, the Social Security tax in 1985 will increase by \$259.20. This larger increase reflects the higher taxable wage base for 1985.

Although people in higher income brackets pay more in Social Security taxes, they also can count on higher benefits when they are eligible for Social Security. Their monthly checks will be higher because benefit amounts are based on the amount of earnings on which Social Security taxes are paid.

Employers also will pay more into Social Security in 1985 since they match, dollar for dollar, Social Security taxes paid by employees.

MIT Receives Nearly \$900,000 In Donations

Data General recently donated an ECLIPSE MV/4000 computer system, valued at \$130,000, to the College of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). The computer system will be used specifically for two courses: the Digital Systems Laboratory and the Micro-Computer Project Laboratory.

This gift brings Data General's contributions to MIT to almost \$900,000 during the past five years.

In 1979 when the Donations Program began at Data General, MIT received \$150,000 worth of equip-

ment. The Cambridge university is also scheduled to receive in the near future, an ECLIPSE MV/10000, valued at \$370,000, which will be used by its Center for Computational Mechanics in Manufacturing. Another gift, an ECLIPSE MV/10000 computer and tw Desktop systems, valued at more than \$240,000, was recently delivered to MIT's Electrical Engineering Laboratory for Information and Decision Systems (LIDS).

During FY '84 Data General donated more than \$8.5 million worth of computer equipment to 29 colleges and universities throughout the United States.

Data General Donates Computer Equipment To UNH

Data General has donated more than \$500,000 worth of computer equipment to the University of New Hampshire (UNH).

"This gift provides our undergraduate students with valuable state-of-the-art equipment," says Otis Sproul, dean of the University College of Engineering and Physical Sciences.

The donation, which includes an ECLIPSE MV/10000 computer, more than 40 terminals and color graphic displays, tape drives, disc drives, printers, software and software support, will be used in the instruction of undergraduate student courses.

"The donated equipment is a major boon," say Daniel Bergeron, chairman of UNH's department of Computer Sciences. "It provides us with more resources and more computing flexibility in instructing our students."

Jim Barnes, vice president of Peripherals Development, adds, "The gift is part of Data General's overall university donation program. During the past year we have made more than \$8.5 million worth of donations to universities throughout the United States. We were pleased to include UNH in our program."

Data General recently broke ground on a product development and light manufacturing facility near the university. The 240,000 square foot facility, scheduled for completion late in 1986, is expected to employ about 1000 people.

"We expect that our proximity to UNH will strengthen our relationship with the university community. We look forward to developing a close working relationship with the entire university community," says Jim.
