Sarkissian Named Sunnyvale Division Vice President

Vahe Sarkissian has joined Data General as vice president and general manager of the Sunnyvale Division.

Data General Reprices Licensing For Ada Products

Data General has announced price reductions of nearly 70 percent for the Ada Development Environment (ADE) software on its 32-bit computer systems. The company also announced that ADE software is now supported on its workcluster systems, and that it is making ADE licenses available to universities at a reduced price.

The price for an initial ADE license on ECLIPSE 'V/Family systems is \$28,000. It includes the Ada compiler and a broad array of development tools.

"The Department of Defense had awarded Data General its second Ada validation before compilers of competitors had earned their first validation," says Larry Holswade, vice president of the Federal Systems Division. "We have a track record in this market and we're committed to it. Today's announcement demonstrates our intention to be a major supplier, offering industry leading systems and software at competitive prices."

Data General also introduced the availability of ADE software on its 32-bit cluster and distributed workstation systems, the ECLIPSE MV/4000 DC, and the Distributed Systems DS/4200 and DS/4000. The price for an initial license is 7,000. Universities can purchase ADE software for \$5,000.

Franklin Receives 32-Bit System

An ECLIPSE MV/4000 computer, valued at more than \$123,000 has been donated by Data General to the Town of Franklin school system.

Among its many applications, the computer will be used by high school students enrolled in word processing courses. The students will learn word processing skills with the help of Data General's CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office office automation software. In addition, they will receive PAS-CAL programming instruction on the system.

Technical Symposium To Be Held In April

The third symposium on "Operational and Technical Excellence in Manufacturing" is scheduled to be held Tuesday, April 23 and Wednesday, April 24 at Data General-Woodstock.

According to Tracey Zellmann, director of Advanced Manufacturing Engineering and Technology, more than 60 Abstracts have been submitted in

response to a 'call for papers' which came following last year's successful symposium.

Manufacturing employees were invited to submit an original and creative idea that makes or has the potential to make a significant contribution to Data General's Manufacturing operations. Submitted in abstract form, the ideas are followed up by the actual papers. The deadline for receipt of the papers is Friday, March 29.

"The symposium offers employees a unique opportunity to share innovating ideas and activities," says Tracey Zellmann. "It also is a means of recognizing those individuals for their efforts."

All of the papers submitted will be presented to peer groups on the first day of the symposium. Dave Chapman, senior vice president of Manufacturing, along with Manufacturing vice presidents and directors will participate in the evaluations. Finalists will be chosen to present their papers to all participants the following day. Prizes will be awarded to the top papers. The top papers will then be presented at the Manufacturing Management Conference in May.

The green banner showed a boxing kangaroo, symbolizing the code name for Data General's recently announced Intelligent LAN Controller (ILC).

The standard 90-day eligibility requirement for joining the Plan is waived for the purpose of depositing "rollover" funds. The monies will be accepted upon approval of the Rollover application. However, interest will not start accruing until the first of the month following the actual deposit.
