

World-Wide Network Links Data General



The Network Control Center at Westboro is the focal point of the world-wide private network.

As a world-wide company, some Data General sites are oceans and continents apart from each other. But that world is becoming smaller, thanks to the system being installed by the Corporate Telecommunications department.

The Westboro-based group is implementing a private network to improve the flow of data among sites around the globe and to curb escalating com-

unications transmission costs.

When the network is completed later this year, thousands of employees at more than 100 sites will be able to send computer-based files and electronic messages, such as CEO (Comprehensive Electronic Office) documents and messages, to one another from terminals at their desks.

A large part of Data General's success relies on the rapid exchange of vital day-to-day information. Currently, this computer-based information is transmitted by a wide range of services including: leased AT&T telephone lines; message networks for TWXs; public packet networks, etc. Yet, while costs to use these services are rising continually, they are becoming overburdened with users, thereby slowing the flow of communications.

The private network means communications lines will be dedicated to Data General use. "In many cases," says Telecommunications Manager Dean Williams, "the network will eliminate the need for Data General offices to use express mail services, commercial couriers and the postal system to exchange internal information and files."

In all, nine Data General sites designated as "nodes," form the backbone of the U.S. network: "'estboro; Milford; Research Triangle Park; .orcross, Georgia; Schaumberg, Illinois; Fountain, Colorado; Austin; Manhattan Beach; and Sunnyvale. The initial phase of the private network, which includes the nine nodes, is scheduled to be completed in April. The sites that are connected to each node (tributaries) should be operational shortly after the nodes are functioning. This will depend on the availability of facilities and any office relocations.

At each of these sites will be switching equipment to route electronic information emanating from offices in that region to their proper destinations. All communications between offices will pass through a node on its journey.

For instance, when a CEO message is sent from an employee in San Francisco to Cambridge it first travels to the node in Sunnyvale, which handles all communications in northern California and the Pacific northwest. From Sunnyvale, the information is directed to the node in Westboro which then sends it on its way to its final stop, a terminal in Cambridge.

"The objective of this effort," notes Dean, "is to create a world-wide, cost-effective network." Currently, selected European and Asian offices can access the network via dedicated private lines. Other offices will use the public data network (PDN), until they can be connected.

Paris, Hounslow, England and Schwalbach, West Germany already are connected to Westboro via the network. Currently, messages can be routed to Westboro from Hong Kong, Singapore, Manila and Bangkok. Nippon•Data General's Manufacturing site in Gyoda soon will be connected to the Sunnyvale node. Connections to Melbourne and Venezuela are planned for the near future.

"The network is dynamic," explains Dean. "As more applications and needs are identified, sites will be added to it."

A Team Effort

The installation of the network marks a real Data General team effort. Employees from Manufacturing, Software Development, Field Engineering, North American Sales and Corporate Software Support (CSS) were involved in making sure the network would live up to the use the company would put on it.

"The contributions of many Data General groups, both domestic and international, has made this program a reality," says Dean.


The Network Control Center (NCC) in Westboro is the focal point of the world-wide private network. According to Dean, the center is a "comprehensive management tool which monitors network performance, collects accounting and statistical information, and provides for extensive network diagnostics. The center monitors the network and serves as a troubleshooter."


Implementing the network requires extensive cooperation between the field offices and the center, Dean remarks. "Each site has designated a project coordinator to work with the NCC on the installation and on-going network issues."


