dBASE III, Framework Software Now Available

Data General announced Monday that Ashton-Tate's dBASE III and Framework software are now available on 3 1/2-inch diskettes for use on the DATA GENERAL/One portable personal computer.

dBASE III is a command-driven, relational 'atabase management system that creates full business systems tailored to the specific needs of the user. Framework is a multi-function productivity software package that combines word processing, spreadsheet, database, graphics and

telecommunications capabilities in one integrated system. Both software packages operate in the MS-DOS environment.

"Ashton-Tate is looking forward to a long-term, strategic alliance with Data General," says Carl Gritzmaker, vice president of sales at Ashton-Tate. "We feel that the DATA GENERAL/One is a significant, new machine that is an indicator of the future of personal computers. As executives become more mobile, it is increasingly important to have computers available at all locations, and that is now possible with machines like the DATA GENERAL/One."

Distribution will be through Data General's dealer and direct sales channels, as well as through the company's value-added resellers. In addition to dBASE III and Framework, Data General also distributes Ashton-Tate's dBASE II and Friday! software. There are presently more than 150 third-party software application packages available for the DATA GENERAL/One on 3 1/2-inch diskettes.

New Schedule For Helicopter Service

Data General helicopter service will operate on a new schedule as of Monday, April 1. The service open to all employees who have business to conduct within the New England Manufacturing plants. Reservations for helicopter service can be made by calling 232-HELI (232-4354). Passengers must be at the helistop five minutes before scheduled departure time for loading and safety briefing. Unless delayed by weather conditions, flights will depart on time.




