"Shifting marketing and dealer responsibility for the DESKTOP GENERATION products to ISD allows the Desktop Division to better focus its attention on marketing the DATA GENERAL / One family of personal portable computers," says Allan Oppenheimer, acting general manager of the Desktop Division and director of Dealer Programs.

Data General Moves Up In Fortune 500

Data General has climbed to 279, up 56 notches from last year, on Fortune Magazine's annual listing of the 500 largest U. S. industrial corporations, based on fiscal 1984 revenues.

Data General's 40 percent sales increase from 1983 to 1984 was the 25th highest increase of any firm listed within the Fortune 500. Rank based on revenue is just one part of the report issued by Fortune Magazine each year. For instance, the company ranked 189 in net income and 206 employees.

Business Automation Solutions Offered

Data General this week announced two joint marketing agreements to benefit the company's business automation customers.

The first, made with Equatorial Communications Company of Mountain View, California, makes available low-cost private data communications networks by integrating Equatorial's large-scale satellite networks with Data General's CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office software, ECLIPSE MV/Family and DESKTOP GENERATION systems.

The combination will allow customers who require data transmission to construct and control their own private data networks linking computer systems via satellite at hundreds to thousands of locations.

Customers also will be able to develop their own business applications through the use of EXSYS, the world's first expert system for software development. The system will run on the ECLIPSE MV/Family of computers and operates within the CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office environment.

Conventional software development is a slop four-step process - analysis, design, programming and testing. EXSYS slashes the time and cost of software development by introducing the power of



an expert system into the development process at the first step, analysis, and eliminating the design, programming and testing steps.

EXSYS communicates with the user in plain English, asking questions about the user's organization and system needs. When the last question is anvered the system is complete and ready to use. EXSYS builds systems directly,, making prototyping tools, program generators and fourth generation languages obsolete.

The software was made available exclusively on Data General equipment by an agreement with Exsys, Inc., a Data General Independent Software Vendor (ISV). ISVs are an integral part of the company's business automation solutions. These solutions combine an integrated work environment, a broad, flexible range of hardware systems and communications capabilities to link the entire system together.

\$156,000 In Equipment Given To Pikes Peak College

Trumpeting "a strengthened partnership" with education, Data General donated \$156,000 in computer equipment to Pikes Peak Community College in Colorado Springs early this month.

College officials said the equipment, three NOVA-4 mainframes and seven MP-100 computers, would enhance the advanced electronics technology program.

"It will be used in the advanced systems program, which deals with trouble-shooting and maintenance of computer-assisted control processing equipment and in the electro-laser optics program," says Don Goodwin, dean of occupational studies. "We envision it supporting the computer-assisted drafting program. It is extremely powerful equipment," Don emphasizes.

Data General decided to donate the equipment to the college when 14 Pikes Peak graduates were hired at the Colorado Springs plant when it opened in 1982, according to Vinu Patel, plant manager for the Fountain branch. The graduates and the Occupational Studies department made company officials aware of the lack of advanced computer equipment at the college, Vinu says.


