

Manufacturing Managers To Meet At Woodtsock

More than 300 managers from Data General Manufacturing facilities worldwide will meet in Woodstock the week of May 20 through May 24 for the 1985 Manufacturing Management Conference.

"The Year of Implementation" is this year's conference theme as the managers meet to discuss the implementation of strategies and programs, such as Statistical Process Control and Cornfield, aimed at making Data General products the best in the industry.

The "cast" of guest speakers at this year's conference in Woodstock includes psychologist Sharon Crain who will talk on stress management, and NFL referee and educator Jim Tunney who will deliver a message on developing team spirit.

Conference highlights also will include presentations from Data General customer success stories the United States Forest Service and the United States Olympic Committee.

In addition, Manufacturing managers will exercise their minds and bodies as they participate in a series of health workshops designed to promote better health awareness.

New Service For Repair, Exchange of Computer Parts

Data General recently introduced Spare Mail, a new mail-in repair and exchange service for spare parts used in the company's computer systems. Spare Mail service features a choice of turnaround times: rapid five-day turnaround is standard, with emergency overnight delivery and three-week economy services available as well. Each level of service provides automatic installation of the latest Engineering Change Orders (ECOs) at no additional charge, giving customers the latest enhancements in performance and reliability. Also available is a Spare Mail option that provides repair-and-return of the customer's original part at its original ECO level.

Parts exchanged or repaired are warranted by Data General for 90 days.

Spare Mail service provides a one-stop repair source for 1,520 standard Data General parts, including circuit boards, disc heads, data module keyboards, and many other electrical and electromechanical assemblies. For each part repaired/exchanged Spare Mail service charges a fixed price, which varies according to the particular part and the Spare Mail option the customer selects. The Spare Mail price includes one-way shipping prepaid from Data General to the customer.

Company Officials MeetWith Colorado Governor

Data General's plans to construct a 300,000 square foot Product Repair Center in Fountain, Colorado were outlined to Colorado Governor Dick Lamm earlier this month by Frank Silkman, senior vice president of Worldwide Field Engineering, and Tony Nicoletti, vice president of Field Engineering Support Services. Governor Lamm voiced strougleport for the project and offered to assist the project in every way.

"What your company is doing in the computer field is very exciting," says the governor who uses a DATA GENERAL/One personal computer for creative writing. Dick recently won a Christian Monitor short story writing award and is now working on a second book. "I am very impressed with your company and your products. We are very pleased you have chosen to expand in Colorado," he says.

Governor Lamm, whose main priority is to upgrade Colorado's educational system, lauded Data General's support for educational institutions and expressed his personal appreciation for the recent equipment donation Data General made to Colorado universities. Data General has recently given equipment donations totalling more than \$320,000 to Pike's Peak Community College in Colorado Springs and the University of Southern Colorado.

Product Development Center In Durham Will House MSE

Data General is in the computer business to supply complete computer systems and solutions to users with a variety of applications and performance requirements. To do that, Data General offers customers a wide range of products to help meet their needs: ECLIPSE MV/Family systems, ECLIPSE system, desktop and portable computers, Advanced Operating System (AOS) and AOS/Virtual Storage (AOS/VS) operating systems, CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office software and a myriad of peripheral products.

"The compelling need for data storage is growing every day," according to Joe Godbout, director of ass Storage Engineering (MSE). The computers of tomorrow will be judged on user-friendliness, cost and performance basis. The Peripherals group is playing a very necessary role by designing products which are in tune with the requirements of commercial, technical and federal customers.

A "Pioneer" Director

With Data General for 16 years, Joe joined the company before it became publicly held. He started as an engineer and as the company grew, he grew with it, designing controllers for tapes, disks and printers. About eight years ago he was promoted to manager of MSE and three years later Joe was promoted to director.

MSE Expands To New Development Facility In Durham

Currently five MSE departments are part of the research and development team. The departments are Advanced Technology, Systems, Disk Development, Tape Development, and Continuation Engineering. Mechanical, digital, logic firmware, servo, electro-magnetic, analog, diagnostic software engineers and technicians comprise a majority of the staff. "We also have administrative and secretarial support groups," says Joe. They soon will be relocating into a 90,000 square-foot facility in Durham. New Hampshire.

"Our new MSE lab will help us to conduct advanced research, design and produce state-of-theart data storage products," says Joe, enthused about the expansion to the new development facility in Durham. "Having all our departments together in this ideal location will allow us to efficiently manage and control the design, manufacture and service of these products - all under one roof. We are building a top-notch lab in which to build the best products," according to Joe.

Part of the operation will move to a temporary building in Newington, New Hampshire next month, with the full force scheduled to be in the \$31 million facility in Durham by June of 1986.

To keep Data General a generation ahead in peripherals, Joe has a simple, yet effective, formula for Mass Storage. "We must be creative with our design, yet prompt to meet schedules; imaginative yet realistic and we must be able to say with pride that we developed these products."

Benefits

90-Day Employees Can Join Savings & Investment Program

If you are a new Data General employee, and will have completed 90 days of employment before July 1, you will be eligible to join the Savings & Investment program effective July 1, 1985.

A packet of descriptive material will be mailed to your home this month. If you do not receive this information contact your Benefits or Personnnel representative.

The Data General Savings & Investment program allows you to save up to 10 percent of your pay before federal income tax is withheld. There are three investment funds to choose from, and you have access to your money through the loan and hardship provisions.

After reading the information, complete the enrollment form and submit it to your Benefits or Personnel representative. If you decide not to contribute to the program at this time, you must still complete an enrollment form to provide us with the name of your beneficiary for the company contribution.

If you have any questions regarding the program contact the Benefits department in Westboro at extension 4524.

Updating Your Address

Employees are eligible for a wide variety of benefits and services from Data General, and updating all records to reflect a change of address is often a multi-step process. A list of who should be notified when your mailing address changes follows:

Changing Personnel and Payroll records:

If your paycheck does not reflect your correct address contact your supervisor who will submit the change of address on your Employee Profile Document (EPD). Revising your EPD will update your Personnel records, ensuring you receive documents mailed by the company.

Changing auto, homeowner's or renter's insurance record

Contact Marsh & McLennan at extension 4603 in Westboro with change of address information. Marsh & McLennan does not have access to Data General's EPD records.

Union Warren Savings Bank or Local savings bank/credit union

Contact them directly for personal account records. They do not receive revised EPD information.

Stock Certificates

Contact or write the transfer agent at Morgan Guaranty Trust, Operations Department, 30 West Broadway, New York, NY 10015. If you have more than one account, specify the name and address for each account. If any certificates are held in joint tenancy, specify correct address of each tenant.

Medical

If your medical coverage is with a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) contact your local Benefits administrator for an address change form. HMO's service specific geographic locations, so a change of residence could effect your coverage. Your HMO requires your correct mailing address for medical records and home mailing purposes.

Savings and Investment

Contact the Benefits department in Westboro at extension 4524 or 4558. Revised EPDs will not update your savings and investment records.

While waiting for your records to be updated, guarantee mail forwarding by advising the post office of your new address.

Piscount Tickets For Boston & Computer Show May 22-24


