## Portsmouth Opens Cornfield And IC Test Operations

Data General employees celebrated "Blue Ribbon Day At Portsmouth" on Friday, May 17, signifying the official start-up of Cornfield Assembly and Integrated Circuit (IC) Test. Cornfield is the implementation of automated production processes.

In his opening remarks, Portsmouth Plant Manager Rick Edson said that the start-up of these Manufacturing processes was "not only a Blue Ribbon Day for Portsmouth, but also a Blue Ribbon Day for all of Data General. These automated processes will en--ble our company to maintain continued leadership an increasingly competitive world marketplace."
"It was you who made Cornfield Assembly and IC Test a reality," said Rick. "Your teamwork has been a key to our success. It brought these Manufacturing processes from the idea stage, into the design stage, and now, into production."

After a luncheon, employees viewed a slide show emphasizing the magnitude of their completed project and the teamwork and pride displayed throughout the facility. Ribbon-cutting and cake-cutting ceremonies also took place, after which employees toured the Cornfield Assembly and IC Test areas.

Other speakers at the event included: David Chapman, senior vice president of Manufacturing; Frank Silkman, senior vice president of Worldwide Field Engineering; Ken Jaeggi, vice president and chief Financial officer; Jim Williamson, vice president of US Manufacturing Operations; and Tracey Zellmann, director of Advanced Manufacturng Engineering and Technology.
