Genuine Parts Installs 2000th Data General System

Atlanta-based Genuine Parts Company (GPC), an Authorized Data General System Distributor in the automotive parts inventory control market, has installed its 2000th Data General system.

Genuine Parts is a \$1.7 billion-per-year distributor of automotive and industrial parts, and hardware and stationery products.

The company resells DESKTOP GENERATION and ECLIPSE computers with its own TAMS (Total Auto-

motive Management System) inventory control software to NAPA-affiliated jobber stores. These stores supply replacement parts to automotive repair shops, and to the public through retail sales.

"We entered the systems business in 1976 to streamline the inventory process for our jobber customers," says Jay Burnworth, GPC director of customer systems. "TAMS has been a success because it is truly a cost-effective system that can pay for itself."

Data entry at the point of sale generates a customer invoice and automatically updates the store's inventory and accounts receivabe. Stock orders are requested as a result of a scan of the up-to-the-minute inventory figures. In addition, jobbers can closely monitor sales activity by utilizing TAMS to generate analysis reports.

Can Keep Fewer Items In Stock

The system allows the jobber to keep fewer items in stock, and assures that no part is overlooked when its supply is diminished. Jobbers with TAMS will order replenishment stock with their computer system, via telephone, from the computer at the GPC regional data processing center.

GPC distributes about 100,000 different parts through 65 nationwide distribution centers to more than 6,000 jobber stores. A typical store will carry about 16,000 items.

The TAMS system benefits jobbers with increased productivity of counter sales personnel and an accurate, efficient inventory management for better return on inventory investment.

The 2000th computer system was installed at Island Tires and Parts on St. Croix, Virgin Islands. The system consists of a Data General DESKTOP GENERATION Model 20, three display terminals and a printer.

As an Authorized Data General System Distributor, Genuine Parts is part of the System Supplier Program network of value added resellers. These businesses are experts in designing, marketing and supporting Data General system for specific markets.


