Data General Reports 1986 First Quarter Results

Data General has reported revenues for the first quarter, which ended December 28, 1985, of \$293.7 million, compared with revenues of \$333.7 million for the same quarter last year.

Earnings for the quarter were \$1.1 million, or \$.04 per share, compared with \$23.0 million, or \$.87 per share for the same period last year.

Operating income for the quarter was \$4.3 million, or 1.5 percent of revenues, compared with \$35.8 million, or 10.7 percent of revenues, for the same ¬riod last year.

During the quarter, the company renegotiated an existing long-term sales contract for equipment sold in prior quarters which resulted in a \$3.5 million increase in equipment sales and income from operations, or \$.06 net income per share, for the quarter.

Commenting on the results, President Ed de Castro says "Although our current results are compared to the strongest quarter in company history, I am particularly disappointed by the weakness in equipment revenue. Current quarter results reflect a continuing lack of demand in our business sector.

"Although encouraged by the initial reaction to our new products introduced in November, and by the external forecasts for returning economic vitality in the second half of the year, our general business outlook remains cautious."

Data General Contributes To Microelectronics Park

The Massachusetts Microelectronics Center, a \$48 million education facility scheduled to open in Westboro in April, is getting a helping hand from ta General.

The company has donated to the center a pair of ECLIPSE MV / 10000 computers, graphics terminals and associated software, valued at nearly \$1.3 million.

The center will use the systems to provide advanced training and research opportunities in microelectronics and semiconductor technologies for undergraduate and graduate students at eight schools in Massachusetts, as well as scientists and engineers working in the state.

Labs at each participating school will be electronically-linked to the center so that students may have access to the hardware and software tools needed to support instructional programs in the design of very large scale integration (VLSI) circuits. Schools tied into the computer-aided design network are: Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI), the University of Lowell, the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, Tufts University, Boston University, Northeastern University, Southeastern Massachusetts University and Merrimack College.

One of the Data General 32-bit computers will be located at WPI to support VLSI design courses for computer science and electrical engineering students. At WPI, students will be able to design chips, analyze them, simulate test results, lay out their designs, check the layouts, and then electronically submit the appropriate manufacturing information to the center for fabrication.

The other ECLIPSE MV/Family system has been installed at the center in Westboro. It will be used to receive students' VLSI chip designs for fabrication. Chip fabrication initially will be conducted by outside vendors. Ultimately, chips will be built at the center's fabrication facility which is planned for 1987. After the chips are built, students will receive them in order to further analyze their designs.

The Data General computer also will support VLSI design courses offered during evening programs at the center.

According to Data General Donations Administrator Dave Dimmick of Public Affairs, the equipment will help to increase the quality of engineering education in the state. "Helping Massachusettsbased universities improve the quality of education in VLSI design will help to ensure a pool of qualified graduates for employment in the state. Other computer companies throughout the state have made similar contributions to the center."

Finance Names New Director




Tom Herriford


