Westboro High School Receives Additional Equipment

When Westboro High School students return to school in the fall, new Data General computer equipment will be awaiting them.

Data General is donating \$150,000 worth of computer equipment, software and support to the high school in order to enhance the school's computer-aided instruction program.

The new products include an ECLIPSE MV/4000 DC computer system with two megabytes of memory,

120 megabyte disk drive, four DASHER D211 terminals and a letter quality printer.

Data General will replace the existing system, an ECLIPSE S/140. The computer was donated to the school in 1983 for computer instruction.

The company also is donating an extensive array of software to assist students in learning computer languages. The software offerings include the AOS/VS operating system, CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office software, extended Basic, Fortran 77, MP/Pascal and ICOBOL, to name a few.

Don Tocher, division director of Communications and Advanced Systems within the Systems Development Division, serves as Data General's liaison with the Westboro public school system on technical computer support. According to Don, "Data General is helping to improve the school's capability to teach computer science and to acquaint students with computer based tools for everyday business applications. To do this, the company is offering the high school a newer machine that is easier to maintain."

Company Sponsors Flementary School Program

Pupils at the Woodland Elementary School in Milford recently were taken on a high-spirited, learning adventure of dance and music during a performance of the Concert Dance Company of Boston. This educational and cultural event was sponsored by Data General.

During the 40-minute program, titled "All Feet Can Dance," the children had the opportunity to explore all forms of music and dance from modern to classical, soft shoe to jazz. As part of the program, pupils were invited to join the dance group on stage and experience firsthand the strength and coordination required in the various dances. A question-and-answer session, where children learned what it takes to become a professional dancer, concluded the event.

XTS/SNA Backbone Provides Network Link

Data General has announced XTS/SNA Backbone, a communications software package that integrates Data General XODIAC networks with IBM Systems Network Architecture (SNA) networks. Using the package, ECLIPSE MV/Family minicomputers can communicate with each other

through an IBM SNA network, without having to disrupt users' normal operating procedures.

XTS/SNA allows users to take advantage of the company's cost-effective computing solutions while maintaining their current investment in other vendors' hardware and software.

Data General customers can use XTS/SNA Backbone to run CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office software, XODIAC utilities, or other XODIAC applications on the current SNA network completely transparently. Users also can continue to communicate with IBM systems attached to the SNA network using Data General's wide range of IBM-compatible software. They can perform terminal emulation, decision support and office automation tasks. Resources connected to the IBM systems are fully accessible to all users.

XTS/SNA Backbone prices range from \$900 to \$5400 depending on the central processing unit.

CEO-TELETEX Interface Announced

Data General has announced the first TELETEX interface to an integrated office automation system, the CEO Document Exchange VI. It allows CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office users to send messages, documents or charts directly from their CEO workstations to other terminals throughout the world through TELETEX public networks without leaving the integrated office automation environment.

TELETEX message transfer systems send messages at faster speeds than TELEX systems.

CEO Document Exchange VI drastically reduces telephone expenses and improves communication productivity. Because it is fully integrated with CEO, it makes any CEO workstation a potential TELETEX station, providing users with access to the extensive communications networks of the major TELETEX services.

It features message storage/forward capabilities that allow messages to be delivered during lower-cost time periods and provides a directory for efficient addressing to individual CEO users. Unlike conventional TELETEX systems, Data General's CEO Document Exchange VI provides a usage accounting and billing control, and a private use function that allows users to transmit items such as personal files and charts over the TELETEX network in addition to documents.

CEO Document Exchange VI is supported under AOS/VS operating system and requires the Data General/TELETEX Adapter Unit, Model 4554, which includes internal storage to allow documents to be received, even when the host system is unavailable. CEO Document Exchange VI is priced between \$750 and \$4,500. The TELETEX Adapter Unit Model 4554 costs \$5,000.

New Terminals Offer Added Features, Lower Prices



Data General's latest additions to its DASHER Family of workstations offer a range of options for business automation customers. The DASHER D461 is an alphanumeric/graphics display terminal; the DASHER D411 is an alphanumeric display terminal. Both the DASHER D215 and D214 workstations are general purpose, alphanumeric display terminals.

The DASHER Family of workstations welcomes some new members which offer new features and lower prices than previous models.

The new models include:

- The DASHER D461, an alphanumeric/graphics display terminal, targeted for business automation, word processing, and interactive data entry applications. It is priced at \$1495, 25 percent lower than its predecessor, the DASHER D460.
- The DASHER D411, an alphanumeric display terminal, designed for similar applications as the DASHER D461. Its price of \$1195 is 33 percent less than that of its forerunner, the DASHER D410.
- The DASHER D215, an alphanumeric display terminal for interactive data applications, priced at \$895,
 percent less than its predecessor, the DASHER D211.
- The DASHER D214, another alphanumeric display terminal for interactive data applications, priced 31 percent lower than its sister terminal, the DASHER D210, at \$795.

The workstations incorporate new features including a screen saver and a soft set-up menu. Designed to extend the life of the display by preventing image burn-in, the screen saver feature clears the display after a specified period of inactivity. The soft set-up menu simplifies configuration by allowing variables such as terminal transmission speed, parity, a mode of operation to be set by keyboard response to menu prompts.

All DASHER D400 and D200 series workstations are available 30 days after receipt of order.

Data General Dedicates Chihuahua City Facility

Data General this week held dedication ceremoes at its new 42,000 square-foot product assembly, test and repair facility, marking the establishment of the first such operation in the western hemisphere outside of the United States.

Located in the Complejo Industrial Park, Chihuahua City, the facility opened last autumn and recently it completed the start-up phase of operations. Employment is expected to grow from the present number of 35 to more than 100 people in 12 to 18 months.

Data General will be performing several functions at the facility, enabling the company to serve customers in Mexico and throughout Latin America:

- Assembly and test of ECLIPSE MV/4000 32-bit minicomputers (one of the most sophisticated computer systems produced in Mexico today)
- Electrical cable/harness assembly and test
- Printed circuit board assembly and test
- Product repair center

Purchasing operations will be established at the plant, as well. Following Data General's normal purchasing policies, the company will buy equipment and supplies locally for the facility whenever possible. Data General also plans to make some curchases for export to supply its Manufacturing cilities in the United States.

"We are very pleased to have this opportunity in Mexico, and also with the tremendous support and assistance we have received from officials at all levels of government," says President Ed de Castro. "The Chihuahua facility will be the principle source and servicing center for Data General's industry-leading 32-bit computer system technology to Mexico and other Latin American countries. (The company also established a sales subsidiary last year in Mexico City.)

Joining Ed in the dedication ceremonies were Saul Gonzalez Herrera, governor of Chihuahua; Plant Manager Ramon Real; David Chapman, senior vice president of Manufacturing, and Wayne Fitzsimmons, Data General vice president for Americas/Far East.

During the dedication, Ed announced also that the company had donated to the University of Monterrey the same computer being produced at the Chihuahua facility, an ECLIPSE MV/4000. The company also will donate another system to the Institute Technologica Regional de Chihuahua.

"We have brought to Mexico and Chihuahua City a company with a long record of technological leadership and stability," says Governor Herrera.

Tata General will benefit greatly from the resources and market opportunity that our country has to offer. And our citizens and economy will benefit as Data General's new facility becomes the primary source for computer systems of this type throughout Latin America."

Major Acquisition Purchasing Sponsors Buyers' Conference

Data General buyers of capital equipment from across the country recently gathered at Data General-Portsmouth to discuss ways to standardize the company's approach to purchasing the advanced technology used in the manufacture of Data General 16- and 32-bit computers.

Purchasing employees from Data General facilities in Westboro, Milford, Southboro, Portsmouth, Westbrook, Clayton, Apex and Austin had the chance to share common concerns and discuss ways on how to better handle the business.

Corporate Purchasing and buyers in the plants use a "team approach" in working with plant engineers to determine capital equipment and construction needs for the various facilities. It is the responsibility of buyers to request proposals from vendors and to decide which vendor best meets company specifications in the areas of price, delivery date, service, payment terms and warranty. During the two-day conference, the group decided upon standards for evaluating vendors and negotiating vendor contracts according to company requirements.

Says Bob Goodman, Major Acquisition Purchasing manager in Westboro who sponsored the conference, "This meeting allowed all the employees involved in the capital equipment and construction purchasing process a chance to meet each other and update one another on projects ongoing in the plants. More importantly, we decided upon a common approach to working with vendors in the purchase of advanced Manufacturing equipment that will keep Data General on the leading edge of technology."
