Data General Joins Corporation For Open Systems

Data General recently joined the Corporation for Open Systems (COS) as a senior research member. The COS is an industry organization, currently consisting of 23 computer company and telecommunication company members.

The purpose of the COS, a nonprofit corporation, is to accelerate the development and commercial availability of computer and telecommunication products and services that permit open systems interconnection and interoperation.

Bob Miller, senior vice president of the Business Group, will become a member of the COS's board of directors. "The creation of COS elevates industry standardization to a proper level of attention," says Bob. "The move to industry standards is becoming one of the most significant developments in the industry overall. We look forward to participating in COS which will help to develop effective computer solutions for our customers."

Data General has been committed to the open systems approach for most of its history. Over the past decade, one of the company's highest priorities has been staying abreast of new standards and communication technologies as they develop, and incorporating them to extend Data General's ability to connect to computer and communication products from other vendors.

Perseverance Pays For Data General Sales Rep

Data General Sales representatives sell more than just a wide range of computer hardware, software and services. They offer total automation solutions that help to meet a customer's business needs.

Selling to large companies, however, is not an sasy task. A typical sales cycle - from the time the first meeting with a prospective customer is held to the point when a sales agreement is reached - is sometimes a long one. It takes perseverance, tenacity, teamwork, customized demonstrations and lots of time to "close a sale."

And, in the case of Philadelphia Life Insurance (PLI), it took Sales Representative Tina Thomas of the Philadelphia Major Accounts Branch Sales office three years to complete the sale of several 32-bit computers.

PLI is just one example of what it takes to make a successful sale in today's competitive environment. Headquartered in the "City of Brotherly Love," the company is a \$1.5 billion financial services organization outfitted with mostly IBM equipment. However, even though PLI already had several IBM systems, this did not discourage Tina from adhering to her course of action and weathering the competition. Now, thanks to the hard work of a team made up of several Data General employees, PLI is using the CEO comprehensive electronic office system based on ECLIPSE MV/4000 computers at both its Philadelphia headquarters and its Houston Group Insurance subsidiary, Philadelphia American Life Insurance (PALICO).

Company-wide Communication

Making slow but sure progress on the sale, Data General gained momentum when PLI required an integrated office system that also offered maximum flexibility for communicating with IBM systems among both the host and personal computers - and a system to interface with Private Branch Exchange (PBX) and Local Area Network (LAN) communications technologies. Tina responded with a technical recommendation that PLI install the CEO comprehensive electronic office system companywide, with Data General's DG/SNA (System Network Architecture) software providing the communications link with the IBM systems. The system was pilot tested at the Group Insurance Division in Houston, Texas.

Employees Team Together To Close Sale

Sales Representative Greg Rooney of the Houston office joined forces with Tina, participating in cost justification efforts and providing managers at PLI with consultants' information on Data General's products. In addition, Executive Vice President Herb Richman and Business Group Marketing Vice President Dave Lyons participated in meetings with PLI to confirm Data General's commitment to the success of its customers.

The final steps involved a customer reference visit to Data General's extensive CEO comprehensive electronic office installation at nearby Beneficial Corporation; a customized CEO-SNA demonstration that was presented to PLI officials and other employees, put together by Philadelphia Systems Engineers Greg Depta and Gary Wight, and built around PLI's most pressing application requirement; and a tailored, one-year lease agreement.

The success of the CEO pilot has resulted in the sale of the 32-bit systems to the Philadelphia and Houston offices. Further, PLI has chosen the DATA GENERAL/One portable personal computer for its Insurance Proposal software which was originally developed on the IBM PC. The portable systems will be made available to PLI's 62 regional directors and 9,000 agents throughout the United States. In addition, several other departments within PLI have identified business applications which they want to implement on Data General systems.

Philadelphia Major Accounts Branch Sales Manager Bob Zink says, "This situation has all the ingredients of the model case study of what it takes to penetrate a major company - persistence, tenacity, the ability to bounce back after losing, teamwork, executive-level selling, technical-level selling, cultivating support within the account, customized demonstrations, user visits and lots of time. And, Tina put them all together and made the sale."


