Silkman Appointed Head Of Worldwide Manufacturing

Frank Silkman has been appointed senior vice president for Manufacturing, reporting to President Ed de Castro. The appointment becomes effective March 31, 1986. Frank will succeed Dave Chapman who has been named vice chairman, president and chief executive officer at Cullinet Software of Westwood, Mass.

Frank most recently was senior vice president for Worldwide Field Engineering, a position he has held since June 1982. He joined Data General in May 1981 as senior vice president for the Business Divisions after 24 years at IBM where he held a number of management positions in manufacturing, engineering and product planning.

Manufacturing Attitude Survey Takes On New Look

Manufacturing's annual Attitude and Climate Survey will be taken next month as employees prepare to rate various aspects of their jobs, supervision and the company. This year, the survey will be administered at Data General facilities throughout the United States in a new, more convenient and efficient way through Data General terminals.

Employees taking part in the survey will input their ideas anonymously using DASHER terminals and the host system set up at their sites. Administrators of the survey will be on-hand throughout the process to assist participants in using the computers.

Automating the survey allows for faster processing of survey results to facilitate more timely feedback. In the ensuing months, managers will hold feedback sessions with their employees to openly discuss ideas generated by the survey.

More information on the survey will be forthcoming. As the time nears, a complete schedule for administering the survey will be posted at each location. Also, employees will be notified by their managers and supervisors of the specific time for their groups.


In the past, attitude surveys have resulted in enhanced work environments and opportunities for employees.

For instance, in the area of career development, many employees expressed concern about receiving more information on how to assess their skills and seek opportunites within the company. As a result of this concern, Manufacturing Management and Organizational Development (M.O.D.) developed extensive programs for career planning including Career Focus and Career Planning and Development. These programs offer employees workshops, pamphlets and other career-related information.

In other areas of Manufacturing, to better utilize space, Apex and Clayton rearranged offices. Improvements also were made to the cafeterias as a direct result of the survey. To keep employees better informed, Westbrook posts the daily News On-Line service, put together by the Public Affairs department in Westboro, on its bulletin boards for all to read. To meet the needs of supervisors, Southborous developed a Supervisor's Forum. And, to meet the requests for further discussion of various plant and industry issues, many facilities expanded their use of People-to-People sessions.

"Attitude and Climate surveys are an important part of the people programs at Data General," says Guy Carter, director of Manufacturing Human Resources. "The survey centers on work groups, plants and the company as a whole. They give each employee the opportunity to express their ideas and suggestions on how to make the business a success."

Give Payroll A Hand

In order to help the Westboro Payroll group process pay checks in a timely fashion, please remember the following:

- Time cards are due in the Payroll department by 10:00 a.m. Monday mornings. Cards received after this time will require manual processing and the resulting paycheck will not be available until 3:00 p.m. Friday afternoons.
- All time cards should be signed in ink (no signature stamps) by the individual employee and at least one level of supervisory personnel. The cognizant supervisor may, in the event of the employee's absence, sign on behalf of the employee. In these instances, the supervisor should sign the employee's name followed by the supervisor's initials.
- Any adjusts/corrections made to a time card must bear the initial of the approver. Any policy absences or exceptions to policy must be described on the reverse side of the time card. All policy absences also should be approved by Human Resources.
- Any employee transferring from one division to another is reminded that his/her direct deposit will stop. The employee should submit a new direct deposit form with a voided blank check attached to the payroll department.

Direct Deposit For Expense Checks

The Corporate TECS department of Manchester has implemented a feature that provides employees with a convenient, safe and timely way to deposit expense reimbursement checks.

As of March 24, all Westboro, Manchester and field employees can have their TECS expense reimbursement checks directly deposited to their appropriate bank accounts. Once deposited, employees will receive a CEO comprehensive electronic office software message informing them of the deposit, as well as a hard-copy form.

Pay The Bills On Time

In order to ensure that Data General vendors are paid on time for their services, Accounts Payable is urging employees to adhere to the following steps:

- Requisitioners should take the time to ensure that the costs for needed services and/or supplies do not exceed the dollar amount listed on an approved Purchase Requisition. Employees requesting services/supplies should be sure to obtain the correct prices before having Purchase Requisitions approved. Since only those amounts listed on a Purchase Requisition can be paid to vendors, an additional requisition form will need to be filled out, and subsequently approved, to authorize payment.
- Requisitioners must forward "proof of receipt" for supplies to Accounts Payable before the Manchester group can pay for the received supplies. A proof of receipt can be a packing list or bill of laden. Without this, Accounts Payable cannot generate payment. These proofs of receipt, with the correct purchase order number, should be sent to Manchester, to the attention of Accounts Payable.
- On service-type purchase orders, requisitioners MUST sign the invoices for their orders. This will help Accounts Payable realize that the services ordered were indeed provided. The requisitioner-signed invoices, with the correct purchase order number, should be sent to Manchester, to the attention of Accounts Payable.
