ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC Computer A Big Hit At Beneficial

Beneficial Corporation, the nation's largest, independent consumer finance company, has received an initial shipment of 21 Data General ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC computers. This is part of its initial order for 200 of the new Data General systems.

Commenting on the reception of the new products, Dave Lyons, vice president of Business Group Marketing, says, "Market reaction to our new generation of 32-bit minicomputers has been excellent. Orders for ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC computers have exded our initial expectations."

"We have now received orders for more than 2,000 ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC computer systems and have shipped more than 1,000 of them worldwide," adds Frank Keaney, vice president of the North American Sales Division.

Beneficial Corporation's current CEO comprehensive electronic office network, based at its headquarters in Peapack, N.J., is one of the largest installations in the world. With more than 1,100 branch offices, Beneficial's worldwide processing network will be one of the most sophisticated information systems in the financial services industry.

In addition to the initial order for 200 systems, Beneficial has made a commitment to order more than 1,000 ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC processors. The new ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC systems will be integrated into the network linking loan offices to each other as well as to corporate headquarters. Chief Pilot John Anderson Honored For Safety Efforts

John was chosen from a group of 185 helicopter pilots who comprise the NEHPA. Some of these pilots fly commercially, like John, while other aircraft operators work for the Air Force, Navy or Army National Guard Reserve. The group's primary goal is to promote a safety-oriented, professional environment among helicopter pilots and the communities in which they operate.

The NEHPA safety award is presented each year to a helicopter pilot who exhibits exemplary performance in the area of safety in flying. The honor memorializes Dennis Repole, a pilot who died in a helicopter crash while working for WCVB-TV.

According to Carl Towle, NEHPA president, John was chosen for this honor because of "his exemplary attitude and willingness to work hard and do a thorough job at making things work properly." SCarl, "As a professional pilot at Data General, John enjoys what he's doing. He has a basic, healthy attitude when it comes to helicopter safety and this clearly comes across with the community and association of heliports. He does not push to fly during adverse weather conditions, nor does he push people who may be apprehensive into flying. Instead, he remains safety conscious at all times, explaining the functions of the helicopter to his passengers and making them feel relaxed."

"Helicopters have no real value if people are not comfortable in using them as tools in everyday situations," adds Carl. "John puts forth an outstanding effort in working with employees at Data General as well as other people in the community to educate them about helicopters and related safety issues."

Comments John on receiving the award, "The greatest honor a person can receive is recognition from his peers. I am pleased to accept this award, not only for myself, but also for Data General. The company's support makes it easy to operate safely.

Savings & Investment Plan Deadlines For June

Fund Transfers

June 13 is the deadline for submitting Fund Transfer forms. Participants in the Savings & Investment Plan can transfer all, or part, of their account balance from one investment fund to any other investment fund(s) at the start of any calendar quarter BUT not more than once every six months.

If you would like to transfer funds for the calendar arter beginning Tuesday, July 1, you must complete a Fund Transfer form and return it to the Benefits department in Westboro no later than Friday, June 13.

The transfer of funds will not affect your future deferrals. If your intention is to have all deferrals after Tuesday, July 1 directed to a different fund(s) you must submit an updated Enrollment Form to the Benefits department no later than Friday, June 13.

Enrollments And Changes

June 13 is the deadline for submitting all new enrollments and quarterly changes. The enrollment forms (used for both new enrollments and changes) must be returned to the Benefits department in Westboro by Friday, June 13. All enrollments and changes will become effective Tuesday, July 1.

The Savings & Investment Plan is available to all regular employees who have at least 90 days of service with the company as of July 1, 1986. Newly-eligible employees were sent a home mailing containing information about the program and the enrollment procedure. If you have not received this information, contact your Human Resources or Benefits representative immediately.

New Stock Purchase Period Starts August 1

Information and enrollment forms for the Employee Stock Purchase program will be mailed to the homes of NEWLY-eligible employees during the week of June 16.

Regular employees who work at least 20 hours-a-week and have one year of service on August 1 are eligible to have a specific dollar amount deducted from their paycheck each week to purchase Data General stock. The amount of the deduction can be as low as \$5 or as high as 10 percent of basic earnings on the first day of the period. The stock will be purchased at 85 percent of the average market price on the first or last day of the payment period, whichever is lower. The new payment period will extend from Friday, August 1 to January 30, 1987.

If you currently are participating in the plan and wish to make a change for the period beginning Friday, August 1, you can obtain the necessary form from your Human Resources representative or your local Benefits department.

Employees who receive sales commissions are reminded that the 10-percent maximum they can contribute to the program is based on their Benefit Salary, NOT their base pay.

Also, all employees are reminded that when they receive an increase in pay, the percentage of their contribution does not automatically increase to reflect the pay raise. They must submit a new Authorization form specifying the amount they would like to contribute.

New participants or those making changes must complete an Authorization form and return it to the Benefits department no later than Friday, July 18.

The Stock Purchase Plan is explained in a prospectus and a Stock Plan booklet available through your local Benefits administrator or the Corporate Benefits department in Westboro.
