Worldwide Field Engineering Vice President Appointed

Dick Camuso has been named senior vice president for the Worldwide Field Engineering division, reporting to Herb Richman, executive vice president. Dick succeeds Frank Silkman, who became senior vice president of Manufacturing last March.

Dick is responsible for the overall management, direction and administration of Data General's Field Engineering operations worldwide, including product repair centers, customer support programs and marketing services, and logistical support.

Herb says, "Our Field Engineering operations today are one of the strongest and most responsive customer service organizations in the computer industry. Dick brings extensive management experi-

ce to Data General that will help us reach even ...gher levels of customer support."

Dick joins Data General after 22 years at IBM, where he held numerous executive and management positions in different areas of the computer business.

He was vice president of finance and planning for IBM's Customer Service Division, responsible for small systems, office systems and office products; vice president of finance and planning for the National Distribution Division, responsible for the marketing of low-end products including personal computers, typewriters and System 36 computers to remarketers; controller for the Office Products Division; and controller of the Data Processing Division, responsible for the marketing of medium/large computer systems.

A native of Lawrence, Mass., Dick received his master of business degree in finance from Columbia University in 1964, and a BA in economics from Georgetown University in 1962.

Reporting to Dick are Bill Bentley, vice president of North American Field Engineering, Fred Cochrane, vice president of Engineering Services, and Tony Nicoletti, vice president of Field Engineering Support.

Data General Incorporates Semiconductor Technology

Data General has signed an agreement to purchase a minority interest in Actel Corporation, a newly-formed semiconductor firm based in Sunnyvale. As part of the agreement, Data General will be represented on Actel's board of directors.

Data General and Actel also will enter into a three-year engineering development agreement that will allow Data General to incorporate the resulting semiconductor technology into its products.

"This relationship with Actel is the first in what will be a series of moves that will make our Sunnyvale Division one of the industry's foremost developers of innovative silicon systems," says Colin Crook, senior vice president of Data General.

"Our strategy is to utilize the most advanced electronic components in the design and manufacture of systems that meet the long-term needs of our customers," says Vahe Sarkissian, vice president of the Sunnyvale Division. "This agreement is an important step in that direction."

Under the terms of the joint engineering development agreement, Actel and Data General will design and develop semiconductor products based on Actel's new technology.

Data General support will include personnel and the use of test equipment, wafer fabrication and engineering facilities at its Sunnyvale Division as well as other unspecified resources.

Data General Users Group To Convene In Orlando

Data General computer users from across North America soon will gather at the 13th annual North American Data General Users Group (NADGUG) conference to share information on their various types of computer systems and software applications.

The meeting, to be held Tuesday, August 12 through Thursday, August 14 in Orlando, will provide three days of informative sessions and round tables led by customers, independent software and hardware vendors, original equipment manufacturers (OEM) and Data General employees.

A special guest speaker will be Dr. Daniel Burris, a noted futurist, who will offer his comments on future directions within the computer industry. Dave Lyons, vice president of Business Group Marketing, also will serve as a guest speaker.

For those able to arrive on Monday, Educational Services will offer a selection of technical seminars. The seminars will cover topics ranging from computer-aided design/computer-aided manufacturing (CAD/CAM) applications on Data General engineering workstations to the company's personal computer networking architecture to an overview of AOS/DVS, Data General's new distributed operating system. Also offered on Monday will be a special CEO comprehensive electronic office software workshop. It will include a discussion on installing CEO software within an organization.

NADGUG is made up of all types of users and OEMs - from large corporations using advanced electronic networks of Data General computers to small businesses using DESKTOP GENERATION systems; and from Management Information Systems (MIS) managers to CAD/CAM engineers.

Data General's Systems Division played an integral role in helping E.F. Hutton expand its extensive and sophisticated CEO comprehensive electronic office network, which electronically links E.F. Hutton's employees throughout the world.

E.F. Hutton is one of the largest financial services companies in the world. It currently has about 250 ECLIPSE MV/Family computers which are part of Hutton's Branch Information Processing System (BIPS). Through BIPS, computing power is distributed to more than 400 branch offices supporting 10.000 users.

Systems Division employees developed a "customized" software program which allowed E.F. Hutton's stock brokerage software to interact with the CEO comprehensive electronic office system. This made it possible for computer users at E.F. Hutton to transfer messages and files between the two different systems so that users could take advantage of CEO office automation functions such as mail, filing, document viewing, indexing, document and message printing.

The project involved the cooperation of the Systems Division at both Cambridge and Santa Ana, Calif., along with the CEO development group at 'Mestboro. Under the direction of Project Manager ank Frazier, the project team brought together a wide range of programming skills in a coordinated effort to produce a high-quality product in a timely manner.

M.O.D. Courses Study How To Run The Business

A pair of courses specifically designed for Data General senior managers recently was sponsored by Corporate Management and Organizational velopment (M.O.D.). *Managing Innovation* and *Advanced Management* each were week-long seminars held at Woodstock.

Sponsored jointly by Corporate M.O.D., the Business Divisions and Corporate Technology, *Managing Innovation* helped participants deal with complex issues that impact the management of technology.

A group of 25 managers from the Systems Development Division (SDD), Corporate Technology, Product Marketing and Field Engineering attended the course.

Lectures, discussions and case studies had the managers actively involved in analyzing and solving concerns specific to the product innovation process at Data General. The course concluded with team presentations of issues and recommendations to Tom West, vice president of SDD, and Vahe Sarkissian, vice president of the Sunnyvale Division.

The second course offered by M.O.D., Advanced Management, provided senior managers from all areas of the business with an increased understanding of their role in keeping the company a success. A group of 18 managers from the North American Sales Division, Field Engineering, Manufacturing, Customer Service, Americas/Far East and the Bress Divisions took part in the program.

Taught by two Northeastern University professors, the program used case studies from the high technology industry as models for solving issues that may arise in employees' own work situations. Participants teamed up and presented their ideas to Tony Nicoletti, vice president of Field Engineering Support, and Larry Holswade, Federal Systems Division vice president.

Participants welcomed the opportunity to share their strategies with the executives, and felt it was a fitting conclusion to the week's activities.




