Data General Employees In The Community

Long-Term Employee Finds Satisfaction In Helping Others

Nick Baker has made a successful career of helping others inside and outside of Data General.

Since joining the company 11 years ago as a Software Reproduction supervisor at Southboro, he has seen the company grow from a small "shortsleeves" business environment of 3500 employees to a \$1.24 billion company of approximately 16,000 employees worldwide. And with that growth, Nick has progressed in his career, now managing the 75-member Manufacturing Engineering department.

As Nick's responsibilities at work grew throughout the years, so too did his dedication to civic responsibility and community service. He has been involved in many civic activities in nearby Shrewsbury, working as a special police officer, Town Meeting member, Civil Defense deputy director, Explorer Scouts leader and officer of the Rotary Club.

"Enthusiasm for Shrewsbury," Nick recalls, "combined with a personal interest in law enforcement, first led me to volunteer as a special police officer in Shrewsbury. Soon after, a network of contacts encouraged me to become further involved in public service."

This year, Nick was elected president of the Shrewsbury Rotary Club. In his eighth year as a member, he now presides over a group of 45 business leaders from various industries in the local area. Through fund-raising efforts, the group supports Shrewsbury social service organizations, "especially youth and families who are in need," says Nick.

For Nick, another vehicle for "reaching out and making an impact on the lives of others" is participation in the Explorer Scouts. He is the leader of the high-school-age group, which gives students an opportunity to experience a career field in which they may later pursue.

For instance, Nick's post has worked in the world of law enforcement. "Since exploring the law enforcement field, some kids have gone on to become police officers. While others have decided that 'Starsky and Hutch' is a good television program, but that kind of occupation is not for them," explains Nick. "In this way, the group reaches out to youth who may need some direction."

In addition to community work, Nick also finds time to serve as a liaison between Data General and his alma mater, Worcester Polytechnic Institute. He helps to encourage the brightest young graduates to join the company.

All of this activity, says Nick, has had a "positive effect" on his career. He finds that, "volunteer organizations are the true test of management skills."

"As a leader of a group, I must learn to motivate people without the enticement of salary and other reinforcements, "Nick comments. "Community organizations let me practice those skills."

According to Nick, juggling the demands of a family, career and volunteer work takes some organi-

zational skill, as well. "You have to set priorities and you cannot be afraid to say 'no' to some events, if they infringe on your private time. For example, Sundays are strictly family days for me. Whatever we do is decided between me and my family."


