
Foxworthy Appointed Field Engineering Director


Think Security!

Corporate Safety/Security this fall is kicking off a new program designed to keep "security awareness" in the eyes and minds of all employees. A series of four, full-color, 8 1/2-by-11-inch posters, each carrying variations on the theme "keep company confidential information secure," will be distributed to Data General offices and facilities worldwide at the beginning of each quarter during fiscal year 1987.

Keeping company information secure is a matter of concern to all employees. The competitive advantages which Data General has attained are directly attributable to employees' ability to keep Data General proprietary information to themselves. The posters help convey that message.

"A picture is worth a thousand words," says Harvey Burstein, director of Corporate Safety and Security. Harvey called upon Educational Services in Westboro for its help in designing and producing the posters. Tim Foley, group leader and senior graphics illustrator within Documentation Design, created the series which depict real-life situations in which the security of Data General assets may be at risk.

The first in the series of security posters will be posted at all Data General facilities worldwide at the beginning of fiscal year 1987. The remaining three posters will be mailed out for posting as each each new quarter approaches.

Optical Disk Subsystem Has High-Capacity Storage

Data General has announced an optical disk subsystem designed for Data General computer systems and targeted at applications requiring the long-term storage of permanent records. The 1-gigabyte (1 billion bytes) optical disk subsystem (Model 5070 OD) is a compact, rack-mounted unit, that uses easy-to-handle 12-inch removable disk media.

The optical disk subsystem is particularly useful in medical, data archiving, financial, image processing and other environments requiring high-capacity long-term data storage. The optical disk also is practical solution where access to large data bases is needed.

Priced at \$29,995, the optical disk subsystem is available 60 days after receipt of order.

Data General Distributors Receive Sales Training

Training on how to sell ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC computers to value-added resellers, also known as original equipment manufacturers (OEM), recently was delivered to representatives of several Data General distributors - Schweber Electronics, Almac, Kierulff and Diplomat. Development and delivery of the three-day intensive session was managed by Training Manager Judy Libenson of the Distribution Division.

The Distribution Division markets Data General computers through all reseller channels. Distributors provide two-tier distribution for the ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC system by re-selling this product to small value-added resellers who, in turn, sell their business solutions to small end users. Training is an important element in increasing Data General sales through reseller channels.

Developing a course specific to the distributors' selling needs took a great deal of thought and preparation, as no such course materials were yet available. Judy received input on requirements from Distributor Manager Randy Glickman and the distributors, themselves. She then worked with employees from various groups throughout Data Genersuch as Marketing Education, Educational Services, Field Engineering, Manufacturing, Corporate Systems Support at both Westboro and RTP, the North American Sales Division and Sales Administration, to develop a curriculum geared specifically to the target audience, and to assign and brief instructors.

As Channel Development Manager Anne Peter (plains, Judy's efforts proved fruitful. "Judy's indepth knowledge of how to organize and deliver a successful class made it possible for her to manage and coordinate many different pieces and put them all together into a coherent session which focused on specific channel needs. The training was a success."

The class was well received by the attending senior sales managers and product managers, who commented on the "high degree of professionalism and enthusiasm shown by the instructors." They also expressed their appreciation for the training support provided - support that will help them win new sales for Data General.


