\$10.5-Million Order Received For MV/Systems

Data General has received a \$10.5-million order for ECLIPSE MV/Family computers from Information Access Inc. (IAI) of Cleveland, Ohio, a Data General Authorized System Distributor. Two of Data General's newest computer systems, the ECLIPSE MV/20000 and ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC, are included in this order.

IAI develops and markets computerized data processing systems for medium- and large-size manufacturers' representatives in the food brokerage and general merchandise industries. Its primary software product, Sequiter VII, is written in ICOBOL and runs on Data General's AOS/VS operating system.

The software provides manufacturers' representatives and food and candy brokerage houses with front-end order entry and complete sales analysis. This includes the ability to calculate brokerage fees based on dollar value or amount ordered, promotion tracking, electronic order transmitting, invoice reconciliation, inventory control, new account placements and word processing, among other sales-support functions.

Under the terms of the agreement, IAI will purchase Data General 32-bit ECLIPSE MV/Family computer equipment during the next three years. sides the ECLIPSE MV/20000 and ECLIPSE MV/2000 DC computers, the sale includes the ECLIPSE MV/4000, ECLIPSE MV/8000 and ECLIPSE MV/10000 systems, and the DESKTOP GENERATION line of microcomputers and terminals.

"Data General continues to provide compatible hardware products which allow us to protect our investment in application software," says IAI President Richard Safier and Edward Schnell, IAI executive vice president.

"We have witnessed Data General's long-standing commitment to product line integration which allows our applications to run the breadth and width of its entire hardware line. In this way, our investment in software and our customers' investment in their database are retained, while at the same time we both take full advantage of any new technology. Data General's ECLIPSE MV/Family of computers offers price/performance leadership on top of a solid operating system."

IAI has been a Data General customer since 1977 and an Authorized System Distributor since November 1983.

To assist employees in future planning, the Data General fiscal year 1987 calendar has been reprinted on the back page of today's *Mini News*.


Train The Trainer Offered For Employees

September Deadline For Savings And Investment Plan

Friday, September 12 is the deadline for sumitting all new enrollment, quarterly change and fund transfer forms for the Savings and Investment Plan. Enrollment forms (used for both new enrollments and changes) and Fund Transfer forms
