Conference Promotes Communication

Nearly 80 Data General value-added reseller (VAR) companies participated in three days of seminars and workshops during the eighth annual Worldwide System Supplier Conference held recently in Atlanta. It was conducted in order to help VARs better understand Data General's business directions so they may enhance their operations.

The conference gave VARs from throughout the U.S., Canada, Italy, the Netherlands, England, Australia and Nigeria an opportunity to learn about Data General's marketing and product strategies, information they need to help them run their operations more effectively. Attendees also participated in one-on-one consultations with Data General advertising, public relations and training experts so that they could tailor similar programs within their own firms to better market and sell Data General computer equipment.

Cliff Bream, vice president of the Distribution Division, pened the conference by stating that it promised "to be the best Conference yet." And the consensus of the attendees was that his promise was fulfilled - it was the best conference yet.

Two-way communication played a large and vital part in this year's conference as Cliff exemplified in his remarks to VARs. "We need to better understand and implement programs which directly address the real issues which you face both in doing business with Data General and doing business with your customers. And we will. It is one of my goals that while we may not have all the answers by the end of the conference, we will, at the very least, have made great strides toward understanding your needs and translating those needs into our goals."

Business Group Marketing Vice President Dave Lyons addressed the audience on the importance of the reseller channel in Data General's overall marketing strategy. "We consider you - our value added resellers - to be strategic partners in reaching our goal of becoming one of the top suppliers of total solutions," he said. "The reseller channel represents nearly 50 percent of Data General's business. We expect that to continue through 1990. You'd better believe - from the top down -- that we're committed to the channel that delivers half our business."

Industry Marketing Vice President Don McDougall then shared Data General's plans to further develop its focus on industry marketing. "With some markets - we're focusing on solutions, and in other markets - we're focusing on awareness," he said. "With this industry marketing focus, Data General, our system suppliers, VARs, and ultimately the end user, will have the competitive advantage."

During the conference, Cliff introduced the VAR Awards program. Beginning this year, the 'Silver Club Award' will be presented to a special VARs -- those who have been a part of Data General for 10 years or more. Frank Keaney, vice president of the North American Sales Division, then presented awards to representatives from the following companies: Aid In Management, American Airlines/Agency Datasystems, Carolina Cipher, Distribution Management Corporation, Compusource, Genuine Parts, Integrated Computer, Ranac, S.A. Levitz, STS Systems, Ltd. and World Computers.

At the wrap-up session, Frank addressed the issues and concerns expressed by Data General's VARs and what the company is doing to resolve them as well as improve the relationship with those VARs.

Health Services To Offer Diabetes Screening Program

November has been designated as national diabetes month. During this time, the Westboro Health Services department will provide diabetes screening for employees. Data General-Westboro employees are invited to make an appointment to have their blood glucose level tested.

An estimated six percent of the U.S. population (about one in every 16 people) has diabetes. Half of these people are not even aware that they have this condition. While diabetes and its complications are a leading cause of death in the U.S., individuals can treat the disease or reduce their risks of developing diabetes.

A simple diagnostic test for diabetes - the blood glucose test - will indicate whether you should see your physician for further consultation or treatment. The Health Services department also will be able to provide a referral, if needed.
