Holiday Time Cards

Employees are reminded that time cards for the week ending November 29 will be due in Payroll by 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 26. Any unscheduled overtime should be included in the next week's time cards.

According to Ben Dalton, Data General's director of International Manufacturing, the Singapore operation expects to employ 300 people, including engineers, technicians and administrators by the end of 1987.

Outside of the U.S., Data General also has Manufacturing facilities in West Germany, Mexico, Thailand and the Phillipines.

Singapore Facility Dedicated

Data General recently dedicated its new state-of-the-art Manufacturing facility in Singapore before a number of government officials and employees. The 140,000-square-foot facility, using the most advanced manufacturing technology, is the largest Data General manufacturing plant outside of the U.S.

During the ceremony, Data General President Ed de Castro talked about the company's "partnership" with Singapore and the firm's "determination to remain one of the world's leading suppliers of computing and communications systems." To do this, Ed stated that, "We plan to gain increased market share in the strongest growth markets. We will maintain control of the most advanced state-of-the-art technologies. We will continue to offer a very broad product line. And we shall continue to be a low-cost producer of products of the highest quality."

Frank Silkman, senior vice president for Manufacturing, then told attendees that, "With the addition of this new plant, Data General-Singapore will be a completely vertically-integrated manufacturing operation capable of handling every phase of the manufacturing process."

Data General has had a Manufacturing operation in Singapore since 1984 when it leased a 40,000-square-foot facility. That plant handles integrated circuit pre-conditioning and systems integration for 16- and 32-bit computer systems.

The new Singapore plant, which opened last February, handles fabrication of multi-layered printed circuit boards, and component insertion using a fully-automated auto-insertion process.

Lyons Predicts OA Direction

Dave Lyons, Data General's Group Marketing vice president, told computer company executives and industry analysts this week that "the office of the future will expand upon the requirements of the office of today; that is, more connectivity or the ability to incorporate a wide range of products from different companies into a seamless, multi-vendor environment."

Dave's talk came during a two-day seminar in Houston. The forum gave participants from several major computer firms the opportunity to project future electronic office networking schemes and plans for integrating a variety of different vendors' products into a single architecture. Focussing on that subject, Dave told those in attendance that "the critical path to future office automation systems is the multi-vendor environment."

There is probably no better person to talk about office automation than Dave. He was among the Data General employees responsible for bringing CEO comprehensive electronic office software to market. As a result, Dave has spoken frequently in the U.S. and abroad on the topic of office automation and systems strategy. He is currently responsible for business planning, product development, and marketing efforts for Data General's major business groups.

Dave's talk was among those delivered by executives from Digital Equipment, IBM, Wang, Xerox, Sperry, Hewlett-Packard, Honeywell, DEST, Softswitch and Interleaf.

Although there often may be local school and business closings, Data General usually remains open in an effort to meet production schedules and minimize financial loss to employees.

Be Prepared For Ice And Snow

Here are a few suggestions to help prepare employees for old-man winter:

- Equip your vehicle to handle adverse weather conditions. Snow or radial tires, an ice scraper, shovel and container of sand are best kept on or in your car -- not in your garage.
- A tune-up may save you from starting problems.
- Drive slowly. Slippery road conditions warrant added caution when entering or exiting the parking areas. Watch out for pedestrians.
- Brush snow from the tail lights of your car so that they may be more visible.
- At work, park carefully. Snow-covered lines increase parking problems. Use common sense. Do not block in other workers or hamper plowing operations.
- And, do not forget to turn off the headlights to your car.

There Is A Lot To Parking

Data General-Westboro employees are reminded that all vehicles must be properly parked to allow unobstructed access to all roadways, parking and fire lanes.

Spaces are color coded to allow maximum parking. Green-lined areas, found in the west lot, are for compact and sub-compact cars. White-lined areas are for full-sized cars, vans and pick-up trucks. No cars may be parked in yellow-lined areas.

The circular parking area directly in front of the Building 14A lobby is for customers, vendors and visitors to the Human Resources department. Data General employees may not park in this area.

Training

Full Week Of Software Training Scheduled

During the week of December 15, seminars on CEO comprehensive electronic office software and the AOS/VS operating system will be held at the Education Center at 2400 Computer Drive in Westboro.

Advanced CEO System Support (SM518), scheduled from December 15 through 17, is designed for employees who are responsible for the technical support and troubleshooting of a CEO system. This hands-on seminar will help attendees to improve the effectiveness of their CEO systems by correcting and working around system problems. Students in this class should have experience with both AOS/VS and CEO system management, and a thorough knowledge of INFOS II utilization and design.

CEO Toolkit For Application Integration (SM519) will be held on December 18 and 19. This seminar teaches application programmers and system analysts how to use the CEO Toolkit within their application programs. By integrating applications with the CEO environment, programming efforts can be reduced and applications can be learned easily and used by CEO users. Attendees in this course should have working knowledge of PL/1.

These two seminars are scheduled consecutively, enabling interested employees to attend both within one week.

Designing Applications Under AOS/VS (SM508), a three-day seminar for AOS/VS system designers, system managers and technical users, will be conducted from December 16 through 18. This seminar introduces AOS/VS systems designers to the performance-related design options that they will encounter in designing an AOS/VS application. It addresses the key system hardware and software performance issues in an AOS/VS environment, covering specific topics related to scientific and commercial applications.

John Quinn, an industry consultant with more than 14 years of experience in systems analysis, program design and management, and student education on Data General computer systems, will teach this seminar.

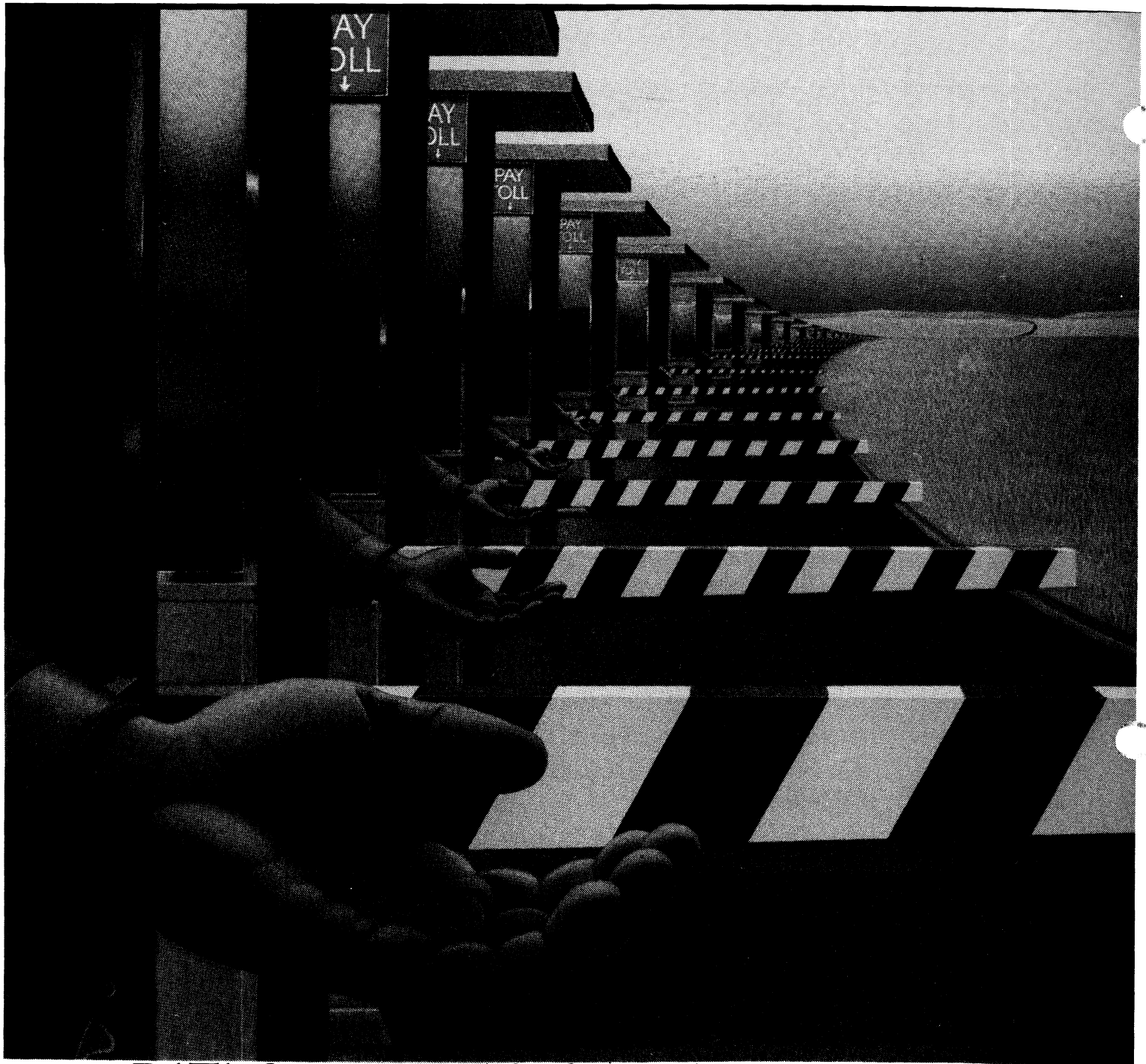

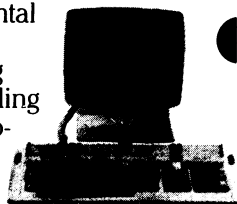
