# The Cup And The Computer



Peter Isler, navigator for the America's Cup winner *Stars and Stripes '87*, called the onboard DATA GEN-ERAL/One computer an "indispensable" member of the team's computer operations during the yacht's effort to capture the cup from the Australians last week. Members of the racing team said the portable computer has everything necessary for a stellar performance onboard a racing yacht, including ease-of-use and an easy-to-read screen. America's Cup fever in the United States is continuing after the Skipper Dennis Conner's sweep over *Kookaburra.* Several radio stations throughout the nation reported on the boat's use of the portable computer, as did New England television stations and newspapers. Also, during this past week in New York City's Times Square, the computer was featured on the famous animated billboard in a tribute to the cup.

# Agreements With VARs Result In \$6M Sale

Data General recently signed sales agreements with two Value-Added Resellers (VARs) for the purchase of Data General systems. Total combined revenues are projected to be in the six-million-dollar range.

The resellers are Globe Information Systems of Tampa, Florida, and Network Computing/HMS Group, of Charlotte, North Carolina.

Globe Information Systems is a nationwide supplier of turnkey ticketing systems to colleges, stadiums and arena operations. A Datapoint VAR for the past five years, Globe Information Systems chose Data General following an intensive competitive review with Prime, Digital Equipment, Hewlett Packard, Tandem, AT&T and others.

Under the terms of the agreement, Globe Information Systems has agreed to a two-year purchase of \$4.5 million worth of computer hardware representing the entire Data General MV/Family.

"Data General provides us with the three most important elements in assessing a supplier relationship," says Fred Maglione, vice president of Marketing for Globe Information Systems. "One, their products offer the most competitive price/performance solutions for the sports and entertainment industries we serve. Two, through Data General conversion assistance expertise, the transition process required to port our existing software to the Data General operating system was executed smoothly and completely. Three, we are confident in the ability of Data General to be a strategic business partner, providing the support and experience necessary for us to execute our extensive marketing efforts."

Network Computing/HMS Group is a leading supplier of information solutions to the local government marketplace including systems for electric, water, and gas utilities.

The company has nearly thirty-five on-line software applications in areas including finance and administration, public works, payroll/personnel, billing, collections, public safety and records management. Software applications are written in COBOL running under the Data General AOS/VS operating system.

"Data General offers a complete line of hardware solutions which is fully integrated, from the low-end ECLIPSE MV/2000 through the ECLIPSE MV/20000 Model 2, and our plans include purchase of models at each range," says George Mackie, vice president of Network Computing/HMS Group. "We have integrated our applications with Data General CEO electronic office automation software resulting in the most optimal software solutions available for local government, utilities and municipality management requirements. The Data General discount structure to VARs is a very positive sign of their commitment to the reseller channel," Mackie says. Network Computing/HMS Group plans to make a \$2-million purchase of Data General hardware within the first year.

"Data General has actively participated in the recruitment and development of the reseller business since its founding in 1968," says Cliff Bream, vice president of the Distribution Division at Data General. "Last year, the establishment of the Distribution Division brought about a corporate-wide focus on the management and support of the channel. In summary, over the past six months, Data General has instituted new simplified discount schedules, opened a Conversion Assistance Center to expedite the process of VAR recruitment, formed regional VAR councils, and expanded the marketing support for its existing VAR base. Today's announcement is indicative of the results of our focused policies and programs for the reseller channel," Bream says.
