Data General Day Tomorrow At Museum

The Computer Museum in Boston will play host to Data General tomorrow as employees and their families are admitted free to the only museum of its kind. All you have to do is present your badge. That will allow you to enter a world that depicts the growth of what many call the second industrial revolution.

Within the museum's walls glow the vacuum tubes that control the largest computer ever built, known as SAGE. Visitors marvel at a pocket-sized calculating 'evice that did not come from the local electronics store, but from an early 17th-century inventor. Youngsters and their parents ''paint'' a picture with a mouse and a computer screen. Others examine a 28-year-old aluminum ashtray, the first object produced using computer-aided design.

At the museum, special presentations of Data General's latest Corporate Portrait, often used to introduce customers to the company, will be shown to employees and all visitors. Data General employees will also be on hand to explain the museum's manufacturing exhibit, which demonstrates how Data General, and many other companies, manufactured computers, from bare boards to finished product. This exhibit uses an ECLIPSE C/330 computer. Other exhibits use Data General DESKTOP GENERATION Computers and a NOVA computer. Employees will also receive a 10-percent discount in the museum store.

The Computer Museum is located on Museum Wharf at 300 Congress Street, right next to the Children's Museum. To get there, follow Museum Wharf signs displaying the wharf's landmark giant milk bottle.

- From North: Expressway (Route 3) south to Exit 23 (High and Congress Streets); third left onto Congress Street and across bridge.
- From South: Expressway (Route 3) north to Atlantic & Jorthern Avenues Exit; immediate right over Northern Avenue Bridge.
 - From West: Mass Pike (Route 90) to Expressway north (Route 3) To Atlantic Avenue Exit; right over Northern Avenue Bridge.

The museum is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Public parking is available on Sleeper Street, across from Victoria Station Restaurant, and other lots in the area. Do not park at Victoria Station or your car is likely to be towed. Cameras are not allowed in the museum.

CM&G is using a Data General network of 33 ECLIPSE/MV systems connected by XODIAC. All run full CEO comprehensive electronic office software for internal communication and 32-bit Fortran 77 for redevelopment of its quotation system and new development of an underwriting system. The company will be using 33 DASHER/Ones to run Lotus 1-2-3.

CM&G is one of the United Kingdom's oldest and most established assurance companies, and is headquartered in Bristol. CM&G offers life assurance, unit trusts and mortgage protection. Two thousand employees handle policy sales worth \$300 million per year.

Training

Courses Scheduled At Education Center

During the weeks of March 23, March 30 and April 6, Educational Services will offer the following software and hardware courses to Data General employees. All classes will be held at the Education Center, 2400 Computer Drive, in Westboro.

Software Courses

- Intro to Data Communciation and Networking (DC131E) is a five-day course that introduces the major hardware and software components of data communication systems and network technologies. Familiarity with basic computer terminology is the prerequisite for this course. Class starts Monday, March 23.
- AOS/VS System Programming, Part 1 (S309/VS) is a five-day course that is designed for experienced AOS/VS assembler or high-level language programmers and analysts. This course covers system call formats, file system, interprocess communication, multitasking, record I/O and processes. Class begins Monday, March 23.
- AOS/VS System Programming, Part 2 (S310/VS) is a five-day course that teaches the advanced system programming features of AOS/VS. Topics covered include memory management, connection management, inner ring servers, user data areas and more. AOS/VS System Programming Part 1 or equivalent experience is the prerequisite for this course. Class starts Monday, March 30.
- AOS/VS System Performance for System Managers (SM524) is a three-day course designed for system mangers and system analysts who want to obtain the best system results for minimum cost. System manage experience and AOS/VS programming experience are the prerequisites for this course. Class begins Tuesday, March 31.
- C Language: An Introduction (SM131E) this special

expanded three-day course is being offered only to Data General employees. The course introduces the "C" language as implemented under MV/UX and AOS/VS and covers data types, arrays, pointers, data pructures, memory management, language syntax, I/O functions, data management and in-depth library I/O. High-level language programming experience is the prerequisite for this course. Class begins Wednesday, April 1.

• COBOL Programming with DG/SQL (S117E) is a five-day course that teaches how to write application programs for data in a DG/SQL relational database. The prerequisites for this course are recent COBOL programming experience and S209 (AOS & AOS/VS User). Class starts Monday, April 6.

Hardware Courses

- Intro to DG 16-Bit Computers (H100) teaches the Data General basic instruction set, console operations and I/O operations. This class also overviews Data General mass storage devices and communication terminology. Knowledge of digital circuitry, number conversions, Boolean concepts and oscilloscope usage are prerequisites for this five-day course. Class begins Monday, March 30.
- Intro to DG 32-Bit Computers (H100/MV) explains virtual storage systems, overviews mass storage devices, terminals, printers, data communications and defines the 32-Bit architecture terminology. The rerequisites for this 10-day course are knowledge of general computer design concepts, digital circuitry and number conversions. Class starts Monday, March 30.
- ECLIPSE MV/15000 Field Maintenance (H178) is a five-day course that provides a functional board-level overview of the ECLIPSE MV/15000 computer. The course covers information flow and control functions within individual boards, between boards and over system busses. The prerequisite for this course is H100/MV (Intro to 32-Bit Computers). Class begins Monday, April 6.

To enroll in any training program offered by Educational Services, call tie line 221, extension 1647. The prior approval of your supervisor is required for course registration.
