Data General Reports Loss; Outlines Program To Restore Profits

Data General has reported a third quarter loss of \$65.1 million, or \$2.40 per share, including a non-recurring charge, resulting from a corporate-wide restructuring and cost reduction program, of \$53.8 million, or \$1.99 per share. The program is designed to restore the company to a solid level of profitability for its 1988 fiscal year that begins September 27.

The cost reduction program includes the consolidation of certain Manufacturing, Field Engineering and other facilities in order to achieve greater efficiency. This will result in the elimination of approximately 950 jobs and the closing of three major facilities.

Data General will work to stimulate revenues by increasing Sales and Marketing initiatives, by further expanding the Sales force and by continuing a high level of research and development activities.

"As difficult as some of these actions are, we are doing what is necessary to strengthen Data General," says President Ed de Castro. "We continue to have a very strong balance sheet and positive cash flow but we also recognize that to meet the expectations of our customers and stockholders we need to produce sustained profitability."

The company's net loss of \$65.1 million, including the non-recurring charge, for its third quarter ended June 27, 1987 compares with a net loss of \$2.0 million, or \$.08 per share, for the same period last year.

Revenues for the third quarter were \$313.6 million, compared with \$325.3 million in the prior year.

Operating loss for the quarter was \$62.1 million, including the non-recurring charge, compared with a profit of \$0.2 million for the same period last year.

The \$53.8 million non-recurring charge to operations includes an inventory writedown of \$12.8 million, plus the costs of facility closings and the accrual of severance pay for affected employees. Total reductions are estimated to lower costs on an annualized basis by approximately \$100 million.

"We have seen modest improvement in orders during the third quarter compared to last year and we expect

this to continue," says Ed. "While we are heading in the right direction in terms of sales, the expenses associated with unneeded manufacturing capacity, partly as a result of the success of our automated manufacturing operations, and corporate overhead have been reaching unacceptable levels.

"We anticipate the actions we are taking today will result in sustained profitability for Data General at current revenue levels in our fiscal 1988 year. Further, we believe the benefit of these savings will begin to be felt in the fourth quarter of fiscal 1987."

Stimulate Revenues

Data General's program to stimulate revenue growth consists of four major elements:

- Strengthening its position in the value-added reseller markets where it has added 57 new VAR customers in the last nine months, thus restoring balance to the company's customer base in end-user markets.
- Refocusing Sales and Marketing efforts by bringing these organizations closer together. This will move the company to a more market-driven orientation by further increasing concentration on solutions for targeted vertical markets through the company's Industry Marketing Division.
- Expanding the Sales and Systems Engineering forces, which grew by 18 percent in the past year. The full result of this program has not been seen but one initial result has been the modest improvement in orders in the third fiscal quarter.
- Continuing aggressive research and development programs, which have resulted in highly-competitive computing and communications products. Research and development expenditures have risen by 10 percent over last year.

Workforce Reduction

The workforce reduction will be accomplished by combining job functions and eliminating certain jobs. The eliminated jobs are in most areas of the company. Affected U.S. employees will be notified within approximately a week, although some consolidation will not be completed for several months. Arrangements have been made for pay continuation for affected employees, for

continuation of benefits, and for outplacement counseling services.

The consolidation will include the moving of certain Manufacturing operations from Southboro to Portsmouth and other Manufacturing locations. Field Engineering headquarters will be transferred from Milford to Southboro. The financial and administrative functions will be transferred from Hooksett to Westboro and Southboro. Also, the Industry Marketing Group, which has been headquartered in Denver, will be consolidated within marketing functions in Westboro. The Milford, Hooksett and Denver facilities will be closed.

Neff Named Sobo Plant Manager; Conlee To Head Materials

Bruce Neff has been appointed plant manager for Data General's Manufacturing operations in Southboro. He reports to Vahram Erdekian, vice president for U.S. Manufacturing Operations.

Bruce has been with Data General for 10 years, He most recently was director of Corporate Materials and Manufacturing Control, a position he held since 1983. Prior to that, he was manager of Fabrication Operations and Quality at Southboro, Materials manager at Southboro, and Corporate Materials manager.

Bruce holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Wisconsin. He has completed the Program for Effective Management of Production Operations at Dartmouth College's Amos Tuck School and attended Penn State University's Executive Management Program.

Bob Conlee succeeds Bruce as director of Corporate Materials and Manufacturing Control, reporting to Lee Henning, vice president of Central Manufacturing Services. Bob will be responsible for Material Planning and Control, and Unit Planning/Forecast Administration. In addition, Bob will continue to be responsible for Manufacturing Planning, determining the Manufacturing division's long-range operating plans.

Bob had been director of Manufacturing Planning since 1984. Prior to that, he held positions within Manufacturing as Materials Planning manager, Forecast Administration manager and Order Distribution manager. Bob has been with Data General for 16 years.

Bob earned a bachelor's degree in management at Northeastern University and attended Penn State University's Executive Management Program.

Software Engineer Receives Award

Ken Ravitz, a software engineer within the User Systems group, recently accepted the Contributor of the Quarter Award during Quarter 2 within the Systems Development Division. The award was presented by Al Scura, director of User Systems. Ken, a project leader, was chosen for his work on the TEO technical electronic office software system. Ken was responsible for developing a menu, icon and graphic-based components for the TEO system for DS/7500 series workstations.

"Ken produced this product with an acute attention to the quality of the software," says Arvind Goyal, Ken's manager. "Despite the heavy usage of TEO, it has a very low problem rate. He produced a quality functional specification which other development groups plan to use as a model. I believe it's important to recognize this kind of achievement."

Ken has been with Data General for five years, beginning in the Languages department. He holds a bachelor's degree in computer science from Brandeis University.

Data General To Market/Develop Local Area Network Products

Data General has entered into a strategic alliance with Bridge Communications for marketing and joint product development of local-area networking (LAN) equipment for Data General systems.

With this agreement, Bridge also becomes a member of Data General's Independent Hardware Vendor (IHV) program, and Data General will list Bridge's products as a Data General IHV for customers seeking gateway equipment. In addition, the agreement provides for coordinated marketing and promotional activities. Bridge's communication and network control servers are designed to enable the connection of terminals and printers to Data General minicomputers via a LAN.

John Scanlon, division director of the Product Marketing Division, says "Data General's relationship with Bridge Communications demonstrates the company's commitment to providing industry leading networking solutions."

In the future, the companies intend to design and develop LAN products based on adherence to OSI (Open Systems Interconnection) Standards. Both have worked together on standards organizations such as the Corporation for Open Systems. Future development will include work on OSI standards based products.

"This agreement formalizes a long working relationship combining the technological leadership and innovation of both companies: Bridge Communications in LAN systems, Data General in office automation, departmental systems, and as a full-line vendor of minicomputer systems. This alliance means that Bridge and Data General products will be better integrated, providing a

more complete and comprehensive network solution to customers," notes John.

Formed in 1981, Bridge Communications of Mountain View, California, is a leading manufacturer of local-area network system products based on industry-standard technologies, including Ethernet (IEEE 802.3), token ring (IEEE 802.5) and broadband.

Data General Helps Algonquin Council



What do scouting and Data General have in common? Camp Resolute. The camp is located in Bolton, and each summer it serves as home for a week to Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts from 18 cities and towns between Routes 495 and 128.

Several employees have contributed their time and efforts to the camp. The camp is run by the Algonquin Council of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA).

The camp has been in operation for nearly 70 years. It offers an outdoor education program each year to more than 1,000 young people on week-long overnight camping experiences. In addition, the Cub Scout day camp, which is also located at Camp Resolute, provides nearly 500 young people with day camping activities.

Dale McCann, director of the camp, perhaps can best see the results of the employees' efforts.

The employees are helping to renovate the camp. They are working on projects which include the winterization of the dining hall and the training center, the building of two new shower houses, a permanent trading post and new staff quarters, and will provide for new platforms, tents and cots for the campsites.

"These efforts will allow us to utilize the camp year-round, making Camp Resolute an even greater learning experience."

The camp provides a wide variety of activities for the scouts, Dale says, which complement what they learn in their respective scout troops.

"These activities range from rowing, canoeing, swimming and sailing at the waterfront to ecology conservation, cooking, camping and pioneering. At camp, the kids can practice what they learn the rest of the year, as well as discover new individual talents and interests.

The staff at camp stresses a team atmosphere, and can supply the expertise these scouts may or may not have access to at home."

Data General's Larry Gruppi, who works in the Design Assurance group, has two sons who attend the camp each year. A den leader himself, Larry has a keen interest in scouting.

"I have been involved with scouting for three years, so I am relatively new to it. But I think it is a great opportunity for young people to learn and grow," Larry says. "Scouting teaches kids about life, and how to get along with others. It encourages young people to try new things.

"A scouting background gives young men an inside track, I believe, when they apply to college or apply for a job. This type of experience indicates that that person is well-rounded, and can work well in a group. The Boy Scouts offers a number of scholarships, as well, on a council or national basis," says Larry.

Dale and Larry agree that they have seen an increase in the interest in scouting of late. According to Dale, the number of Cub Scouts (scouts in the 7-10 age range) at Camp Resolute has doubled in the past year.

"As a result of a successful recruiting session, we have seen an overall growth in every single program, from the Tiger Cubs to the Boy Scouts," Dale says.

Get ready...set...go...Data General's fall Dasher races will take place Friday, September 11.




