Charting Strategies

For any good athletic team, the key to winning is devising a game plan that takes advantage of its strengths and opponents' weaknesses.

To a business such as Data General, devising, adapting and communicating a global corporate strategy covering such issues as corporate mission, objectives, core values and organizational structure is a critical mponent to its success.

Since early spring, senior managers and executives representing all of Data General's business divisions have been meeting every week to discuss and develop strategic frameworks for the company.

"These weekly gatherings function as the process for constructing a framework of strategies aimed at taking Data General not only through this fiscal year, but into the years to come," says Barbara Babcock, division director of the Product Marketing Division. "Reviewing product plans and market requirements, then establishing company priorities in terms of all of the many areas of Data General's business, including product research and development, Manufacturing, Marketing and Sales, are integral parts of this process.

"The factors that are weighed in order to make these decisions are prone to change," Barbara points out. "There is a kind of perpetual motion that characterizes this process of developing corporate strategies. It is important that strategies exist. It is equally important, in light of the constantly changing business environment of which Data General is a part, that these strategies are continually evaluated to address our customers' needs, advancing technologies and our own capabilities."

Framing the strategies for the company's future is an important mission, one that affects every facet of Data General's business. As a result, it requires a keen knowledge of computer technologies and of the market.

"Technology trends provide a backdrop or foundation for developing strategies," Barbara says. "Just as do the needs of our customers. Our customers are smart, they know a great deal about these technologies and are more demanding of companies such as Data General who supply them with it. For instance, they are looking for standards and for a greater variety of software applications. Strategies for products, as well as for development and manufacturing, are formulated with these considerations in mind," she says.

According to Barbara, beginning after the first of the year these strategies will be communicated within each division by directors and managers. In addition, speeches, technical presentations and other meetings with employees, investors, customers and vendors will consistently deliver messages that reinforce this strategy.

Childs Named General Manager For Data General-Canada

Brian Childs has been named general manager of Data General-Canada, reporting to Frank Keaney, vice president of the North American Sales Division (NASD). Brian succeeds Michael Toohey, who recently left Data General to pursue other interests.

Watch Those Decorations
