Employees are reminded that Monday, September 5 is a Data General-paid holiday in observance of Labor Day.

A New Tool For Data General Field Engineers

From now on, Data General field engineers will bring little bit of the company with them whenever they sit a customer site. On maintenance calls, they will be taking with them a DATA GENERAL/One Model 2T EL personal computer.

Under a program called PHARAOH, the computers have been modified so that they contain all the information needed to get a customer's system back "online" as quickly as possible. The systems have been distributed to Data General field engineers across the United States.

"Most of what a field engineer needs to run diagnostics or perform any kind of trouble-shooting at the customer site is encompassed in this modified portable computer," says Laurel Dickerson, a section manager within CBT (Computer Based Training) Development. "In addition to including a peripheral tester, diagnostic loader and bar code reader, PHARAOH can be equipped with any number of on-line training information," Laurel says. From now on, field engineers will not have to carry volumes of manuals with them on service calls. "We can do away with hard copy documentation and load necessary training material into a disk for easy access."

PHARAOH has been designed with field engineers' input in mind. "They are the ones in the field, dealing directly with customers, and they are the ones most nowledgeable about the concerns customers have," says Dennis Symanski, manager of Field Tools and Test Equipment.

Field engineers will use PHARAOH's CDS/FACTS (Customer Dispatch System/Field Activity Tracking

System) access to report customer calls and needs for service, report what they did, and report when they have fixed the problem, eliminating paperwork with an on-line substitute. Using the informational databases, field engineers will be able to access Field Alert Bulletins, weekly software newsletters, patches (software fixes), Advanced Product Information Bulletins, launch reports (new product tracking and reporting procedure), diagnostic trouble and documentation summary reports, abstracts and product support plans - literally, an entire file cabinet of information, all up to date and accessible on line.

"This is a product that we expect will be continually enhanced," Dennis concludes. "Service needs change, and products used to provide service must change, as well. PHARAOH is powerful, functional and adaptable. PHARAOH can take us into the future."

NADGUG Conference Held This Week

Several hundred customers attended the 1988 North American Data General Users Group conference, held this week at the Wyndham Franklin Plaza Hotel in Philadelphia. The four-day conference included management, technical and end-user sessions, exhibits and informal meetings.

The keynote address by Dr. Nathan Goodman, senior vice president of Codd & Date International, kicked off the Conference '88 theme of communications and networking. Dr. Goodman is a well-known expert on relational and distributed database and transaction processing systems. The event also included presentations by Data General executives, as well as a roundtable discussion in which the executives fielded questions from the users attending the conference.

First Class Graduates From New Sales Transition Program

Marketing Education has conducted its first Sales Transition Employees Program (STEP II) class, with

14 systems engineers participating in graduation ceremonies. The four-month training program gives Data General employees an opportunity to pursue careers in Sales as Sales representatives. STEP II has been specifically designed for system engineers transferring into Sales.

Another program currently being developed is the STEP I program. This program will help field engineers and individuals with no sales experience transfer into the Sales force as Sales representatives. Plans for future classes are being scheduled and employees interested in pursuing a career in Sales should contact their Human Resource representatives.


The Hollywood Bowl, an outdoor amphitheatre, is a leading attraction in the Los Angeles area providing classical music-lovers with concerts under the stars.




